Sister Beatrice, well known among former students

of the school in her recent capacity as alumnae secretary and as an outstanding musician, taught music at the Academy for nearly 50 years. She was also in charge of the convent choir and school dramatics. She is a sister of the late Abbot Placidus Fuerns of Mt. Angel Abbey, well known composer and musician. Still active, Sister spends much of her time in making church vestments and altar supplies.

Sister Clementine, procurator at the local convent, spent 33 years of her religious life as local superior and more years as music teacher at different branch houses conducted by the Benedictine Sisters. Sister Gabriel spent her 60 years at the mother-house, where she was head laundress and vestiarian for many years.
