Ex-FBI Man Investigates Housing Board

PORTLAND (U)—Expenditures of the Portland Housing Authority over the past five years were being investigated Wednesday by a former FBI official hired by the chairman of the authority's board of commissioners.

The chairman, newly-elected Jack Barde, said his investigator was Howard Bobbitt, an attorney and former head of the Portland office of the FBI. Barde's action was not authorized by the commission, and he said he would pay for the investigation if the commission does not.

At a story session of the commission Tuesday, Barde said Bobbitt had turned up several alleged irregularities in the handling of PHA funds. He said a preliminary investigation had revealed two non-interest loans to the authority's real estate officer, and an overpayment of \$1,137 to the PHA attorney, Verne Dusenbery.

Barde affirmed that Dusenbery refunded the money—a salary reduction ordered more than a year ago—when notified of the error.

Barde said he was making no accusations, but believed the PHA had been spending too much money.

The commission has been split by dissension since the firing of Floyd S. Ralchford as executive secretary recently.

Salem Jersey Tops State Production

Standard Dreaming Bet Betty, bred by M. N. Tibbles of Salem, won the annual Oregon Jersey Cattle Club Production trophy, according to announcement made Wednesday by Tibbles, president of the Oregon Jersey Cattle Club. The Jersey is now owned by D. A. Messenger of Astoria. Her production record was 16,383 pounds of milk and 1,001 pounds of butterfat.

Second place winner was Sir Challenger Pansy, owned and bred by Ralph E. Cope, Jr., Langlois, with 15,119 pounds of milk containing 937 pounds of butterfat; third, Sir Challenger Marie Anna, owned and bred by Cope, with fourth place going to Volunteer Noble Alice, owned and bred by Mr. and Mrs. John Lindow of Independence.

Three Accused of 'County-Wide' Safecracking

OREGON CITY (UP)—Three alleged members of a nation-wide gang of safecrackers and robbers have been arraigned in District Court here.

A fourth member of the suspected gang, Loren M. Seavey, 51, Atlanta, Ga., was in the custody of the U. S. marshal after his arrest last weekend.

Frederick Claude Blakely, 51, was charged with assault with a dangerous weapon when he appeared before Judge Howard Blanding. Bail was set at \$2000. Frances Jack Dillon, alias Frances Jack Vest, was charged with failure to possess an auto registration card, and Neil Rose Shaver Matthews was charged with vagrancy and carrying a concealed weapon.

Mrs. Dillon's husband, John, 40, was held in the Clackamas County jail for Oklahoma authorities, who sought him for safe burglaries.

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Sacujawea 'Good Rotarian', Declares President of OSC

Sacujawea would have made a good Rotarian.
At least the famed Indian guide for the Lewis and Clark expedition of 1805 was characterized by the "service above self" motto of modern-day Rotary service organization, President A. L. Strand of Oregon State College said Wednesday in Salem.

Addressing Salem Rotary Club after a Marion Hotel luncheon, the college president gave some highlights of the Lewis and Clark expedition on the occasion of its sesquicentennial observance.

The entire expedition party was unusual for its physical stamina, its courage, fine management and attitude, said Dr. Strand.

Rotary visitors and special guests sharing head table honors with Strand included two other college presidents, Dr. G. Herbert Smith of Willamette and Dr. John T. Wahlquist, San Jose State College, who is conducting an education seminar now at Monmouth. All three presidents are Rotarians.

President Strand was introduced by Charles A. Sprague who arranged the day's club program.
