Traffic Deaths Mount

Toll Skyrockets To Highest July Mark in History

CHICAGO UM - Traffic deaths skyrocketed last month to the highest total for any July in 18 years.

The July death toll reported by
the National Safety Council Tuesday was 3,340 - up 11 per cent from July of last year.

Traffic deaths during the first seven months of 1955 totalled 19,-40, a 4 per cent increase over the first seven months of 1954.

Ned H. Dearborn, president of the Salety Council, commented: "The steady increase in traffic deaths this year is a timely warning for the Labor Day weekend

just ahead." While traffic deaths increased, the number of miles American motorists traveled this year increased by a greater percentage. Travel figures were available only for the first six months of the year. These showed deaths up 2 per cent, while mileage increased per cent over 1954. 
