Canada Becoming Worried Over Economic Dependency Upon U.S.

By A. ROBERT SMITH, Statesman Correspondent. OTTAWA, Canada.—From baseball scores to bran flakes, Canada is "almost completely dependent upon the United States."

This observation by a Canadian who has risen high in the Department of External Affairs (Canada's State Department) lends some authority to what is being said by the most casual observer from the U. S. Canada likes and consumes in great quantities American products, ideas and customs of everyday life.

In a Renfrew super-market, a grocery list prepared in Washington, D. C., could be filled with few substitutes, even as to brand name products. Some American firms have built plants in Canada to serve this big market north of the border, but they turn out bran flakes, shredded wheat and other products of American origin.

And like Kilroy, the ubiquitous Coca Cola salesman has long been here. Cigarettes are something of an exception. Canadians are exporting by billboards to light up a Black Cat, a Pleasure or a Sweet Coporal at prices substantially higher than Americans are accustomed to paying.

The latest Yankee and Dodger baseball scores are as important here as they are in Portland or Seattle, for the stars of today for Montreal or Toronto in the International League are tomorrow's performers in the majors.

In driving into this proud member of Her Majesty's kingdom, we had supposed we were English-made auto. But flashing by in their Plymouths and Oldsmobiles, Canadians found our "foreign car" as such an object of curiosity as had our fellow Americans.

ELLENSBURG, Wash. (AP)—Three Air Force men were killed Saturday in the crash of a small plane near Stampede Pass on the east side of the Cascade Mountains.

The Civil Aeronautics Administration said it had been informed the victims were Maj. Edward J. Boten Jr., the pilot; Lt. Col. Granville H. Wright and Maj. Hugo W. Roberts. All are believed to be residents of the Spokane area.
