Painting and Statue Given To Museum

The acceptance of two 19th Century works of art highlighted the September meeting of the Salem Art Association held Monday night at the Bush House.

A bronze statue of a youth representing Cupid, cast about 1875 by the sculptor J. Coutin of Rome was given by an anonymous donor, the gift arranged through Thomas A. Colt of the Portland Art Museum.

The other gift, a large oil painting called *La Culla* by Robert Herdman of the Royal Scottish Academy, painted about 1865 will replace the "Descent from the Cross" which has hung at the rear of the main hall on loan. Both paintings are from the collection of George Guthrie.

Attendance figures Vice Attendance figures at the museum rose sharply during August, reaching \$18 for the month, of which \$16 came August 27, the day of the Art Fair. This function brought the Salem Art Association \$150 in proceeds.

The membership committee announced a special new fall rate reduction, offering new memberships from Nov. 1, 1935 to Dec. 31, 1935.

Shows at the museum currently are the non-objective paintings of Louis Bunce, the picture-of-the-month by Nadine Nunn and the pitcher collection. After October 10 the Bunce show will be succeeded by an exhibition of another Portland artist, John Wadingham, according to Robert Sprague, association president.

National Gallery of Art Soon To Celebrate 15th Anniversary

WASHINGTON—The National Gallery of Art, readying to celebrate its 15th anniversary, is the best-attended art gallery in the world. Through last June some 23,633,000 people had entered its great 12-ton doors. Visitors came from all corners of the globe. It has become an institution for all people just as its donor, the late Andrew Mellon hoped it would.

"If it were older it would have worn floors just like the White House," Assistant Director Magill James told me.

The fall season of the gallery opens October 3 with a special loan exhibition of German drawings, masterpieces from the 15th century through the 18th, from 20 museums and private owners. They are being brought here by the Smithsonian Institution with the cooperation of the West German government.

Sunday Night Concerts In October too, begin the Sunday night concerts in the East Garden Court under the direction of Richard Bales to continue weekly through June. These are free, as is everything else at the gallery, except the excellent food served in the cafeteria. Art and music lovers can spend the whole Sunday afternoon and evening at the gallery and some 1,500 people do.

In anticipation of the opening of its 15th anniversary next March 17, the gallery has launched an expansion program with the construction of five new rooms on the main floor to house paintings donated by Samuel H. and Rush H. Kress, frequent contributors to the gallery. In addition, three new rooms on the ground floor have been brought into one series by pulling down the partitions of the Gallery library.

Well-Known Collections The area will house the world-famous Gustave Dreyfus collection of bronzes of the Renaissance era. The collection of some 1,306 statuettes, medals and plaquettes was purchased in 1940 by the Kress brothers from Sir Joseph Duveen who acquired it from the Dreyfus heirs in 1930. It represents the major enterprise of the life of an eminent connoisseur who between 1870

and his death in 1914, was celebrated throughout Europe for his taste, skill, and critical judgment. The original Mellon collection of 125 paintings and 26 pieces of sculpture, includes Raphael's famed *Alba Madonna*, Botticelli's *Adoration of the Magi*, Raphael's *St. George and the Dragon*, Titian, Van Dyck and others of the world's great masterpieces.
