Seven Firemen Overcome in Futile Attempt to Rescue Four-Year-Olds

PORTLAND (AP) - Fire killed two 4-year-old boys in a gasfilled basement Saturday.

Hundreds of spectators milled outside the burning house in the northeast residential district and the boys' parents were near collapse as firemen failed in repeated rescue efforts.

Seven firemen, overcome by the gas, were hospitalized but rended well to treatment.


