

France's Forces Seem Slowly Mastering Moroccan Rebellion

RABAT, Morocco—French military forces seemed slowly mastering the Rif rebellion Thursday as Premier Edgar Faure prepared to fight for his government's life back in Paris. But while some rebels came in groups with white flags to surrender, French officers reported they were encountering "reticence" in other areas. Many of the warlike Berber horsemen were just vanishing back into

the mountains with their weapons. That meant fighting could flare up again at any moment in the wilder desert areas. For the present, Resident-General Pierre de Latour du Moulin seemed more anxious to gain the rebels' confidence by generous treatment than to pursue them with reprisals. Those who asked pardon were required only to surrender their arms and allowed to go. The ringleaders were being

pitilessly hunted down, however. Spokesmen in Rabat said areas where the tribesmen seemed reluctant to surrender were in the Middle Atlas range near the Algerian frontier, rather than along the northern border with the Spanish Morocco zone. A clean-up operation was reported near the Spanish zone border. U. S. Air Force authorities in Morocco "pulled out 50 Americans, including women and children, from a radar outpost on the Mediterranean coast at Saldia because of repeated rebel attacks in the region. Saldia is in a narrow strip of French Morocco which runs to the coast between the western end of the Spanish zone and the eastern frontier of Algeria. Married American men were moved to larger American bases in Morocco and replaced by single men.

Youth Charged With Homicide After Slaying on Playground

NEW YORK—A high school student was charged with homicide Thursday in the playground slaying of a young park department employee.

Three other youths have been arrested. The park employee, 20-year-old Frank Gargiulo, was shot down Wednesday in full view of hundreds of mothers and children in a playground section reserved for small youngsters. Wednesday night police arrested Hiram Rosa, 17, as the alleged triggerman. Rosa attended the Machine and Metals High School which adjoins the playground, on the border of East Harlem. Also seized were David Vargas and John Barnett, both 17-year-old high school students, and a 15-year-old youth whose name was not disclosed.

Account Given
 Police gave this account of events leading up to the slaying: Gargiulo, a part-time worker for the parts department, broke

up a fight Wednesday afternoon between Barnett and 16-year-old Michael Flynn.

Afterwards, Barnett went to Vargas' home and told him of the fight. Vargas, pocketing a .38-caliber revolver, rounded up Rosa and the 15-year-old, and the four headed for the playground.

Near the playground, the quartet saw Flynn and some of his chums. Vargas pulled the trigger of the gun but it would not fire. When Flynn and his friends saw the four boys, they went into the playground and gathered near Gargiulo.

Asked Question
 Rosa took over the gun and asked Gargiulo: "Are you a friend of these guys?" Gargiulo replied: "No, I only work here."

Then Rosa fired a bullet into Gargiulo's chest.

Police said Vargas and Barnett had been served beer and whiskey in a neighborhood bar shortly after noon Wednesday. As a result, the owner was charged with serving liquor to minors.

24 Reich Generals Freed by Soviet

GOETTINGEN, Germany—Twenty-four travel-worn generals of Hitler's World War II army returned to West Germany Thursday night after a decade in the Soviet Union as prisoners of war.

They were the first of 9,626 German prisoners of war whose freedom was promised by Soviet Premier Nikolai Bulganin at the September conference in Moscow with West German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer.

Bank Teller Gets 8 Years As Embezzler

NEW YORK—A bank teller who embezzled \$65,700, then fled with his family and escaped arrest for 10 months, was sentenced Thursday to eight years in jail.

John Calvin Siemer, 23, tried in vain to avoid a jail term by offering to pay the bank 10 per cent of his income for the rest of his life.

Judge Matthew Abruzzo in Brooklyn Federal Court, rejecting the offer, expressed belief Siemer has stashed away \$35,000 that still has not been accounted for. Siemer took the sentence stoically, but his wife, Henrietta, wept hysterically. Siemer, with his wife and three children, were picked up by the FBI last July in South Amherst,

Guatemala Air Traffic Increases

WASHINGTON—Air traffic into Guatemala has increased 67 per cent since the fall of the communist regime there, says Carlos Chiesman, Guatemala's director of civil aeronautics. Chiesman said in an interview that while there has been a great increase in tourist traffic, most of the air visitors are business men coming into Guatemala on new enterprises.

College Draft Test Dates Set

WASHINGTON—Selective Service announced Thursday that its 1955-56 college qualification tests will be given Nov. 17 and April 19. Students making a grade of 70 or above, or maintaining grades which put them in specified percentages of their classes, may be considered for educational deferment by their local draft boards. Graduate students must make a grade of 80 or above to meet the criteria, or must maintain grades that put them in the upper one-fourth of their class. Local draft boards have the final authority, subject to appeal, in saying whether a youth is to be given an educational deferment. Students desiring to take the Nov. 17 test must mail their applications prior to midnight Nov. 1. Applications for the April 19 test must be mailed by midnight March 5. Application cards and information concerning the tests will be available at local draft board headquarters, the announcement said.

Herbert Hoover Jr. Arrives in Seoul
SEOUL—Undersecretary of State Herbert Hoover, Jr. and his party arrived in Seoul Thursday night on a Far East tour. He will see President Syngman Rhee Friday. "Our trip is designed only to acquaint us at first hand with Far Eastern leaders and their problems," Hoover told newsmen at the airport. Before Hoover's arrival from Tokyo, Finance Minister Him Hyun Chul said he would present a number of requests including one for 100 million dollars in additional U.S. aid to make up a huge deficit in the defense budget.
