Morse Asks State Aid in Car Shortage

WASHINGTON W - Sen. Morse (D-Ore) declared Sunday that if railroads can not solve the freight car shortage problem Congress, along with federal and state agencies, should do the job.

"The American railroads should realize that as public utilities they should strive to meet the peak demands rather than the minimum requirements of rail freight shippers," Morse said in a statement. He accused the railroads of

'heel-dragging" in the face of extremely favorable net railway operating income for the past five Morse said he had received

many letters and telegrams from Oregon complaining about the lack of freight cars to handle shipments of lumber and lumber products.

"There are," he said, "several aspects of the Oregon box car shortage that deserve intensive study and quick remedial action by the Interstate Commerce Commission. In my opinion there is strong evidence of discrimination against Oregon lumbermen and favoritism of California shippers, in the distribution of box cars." "In addition, Morse said, he has asked that the Senate Interstate Commerce Committee launch a long range study of the problem of obtaining adequate rail transportation.

"The time appears opportune." he said, "for a reappraisal of the whole rail freight transportation system. The American railroads should realize that as public utilities they should strive to meet the peak demands rather than the minimum requirements of rail freight shippers.

"From the long range point of view such voluntary action of the railroads could solve the box car problem.
