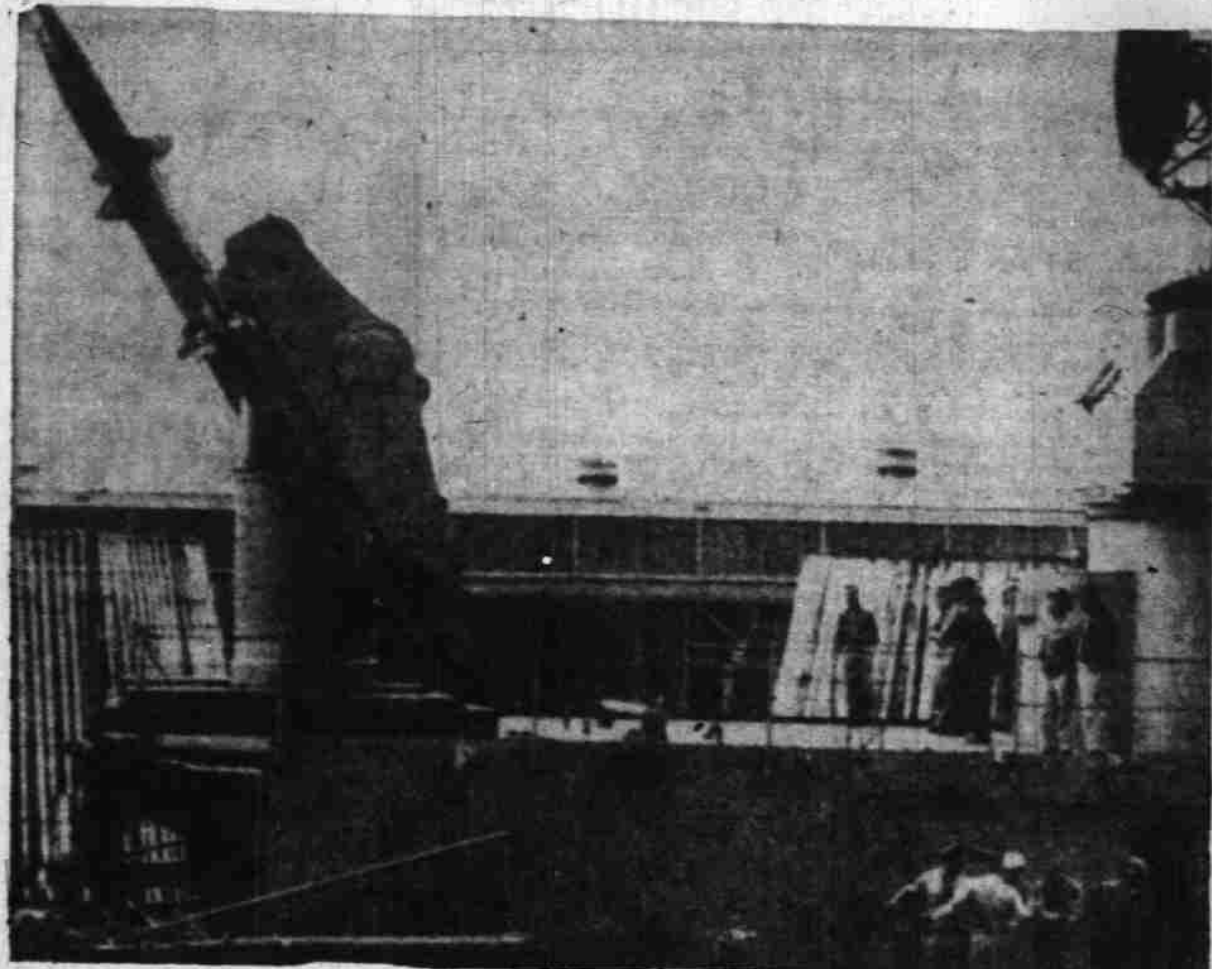


'Missile' Cruiser Ready

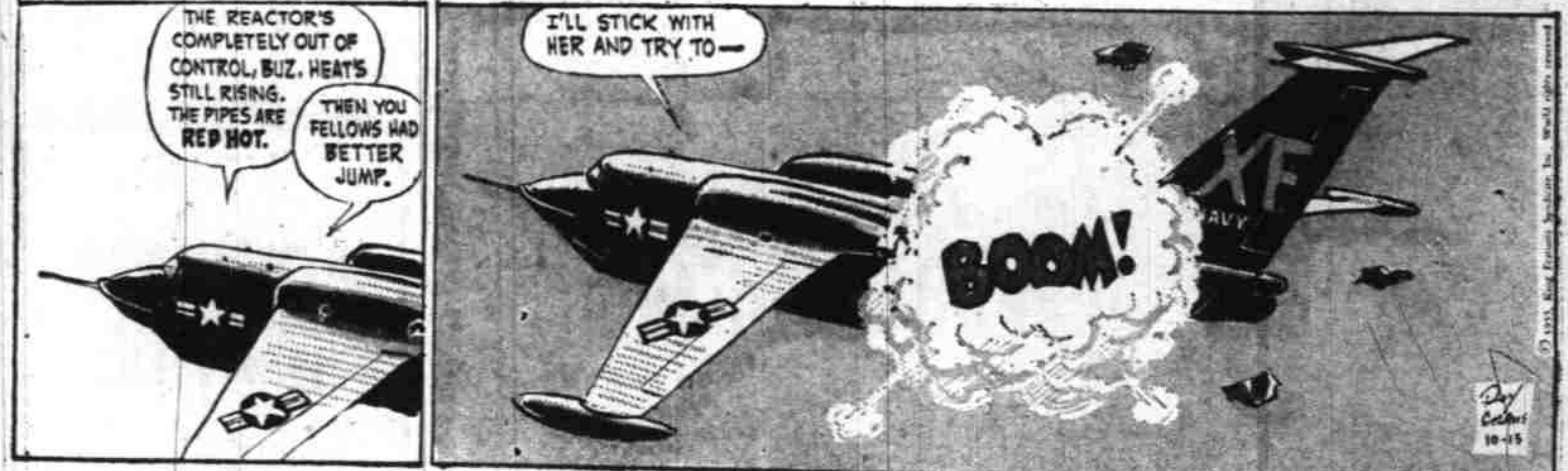
