

# Iowa Arrives For Uke Tilt

Passing Star Knox Okeh, Ready to Play

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The Iowa football team arrived by air safely Thursday and Coach Forest Evashevski decided to call off a scheduled light workout Thursday night in preparation for the inter-sectional game with UCLA Friday evening.

The Hawkeye pilot explained that by the time the squad practiced and got back to the hotel it would constitute too long a day for the players.

The UCLA Bruins went through light exercises before going into seclusion for the night. They are still favored to defeat the Big Ten invaders, who very possibly are thinking ahead to a conference tilt with mighty Michigan.

Evashevski intimated he would revise his original starting lineup a bit, and shoot first with either Eldean Matheson or Donald Dobrino at left halfback instead of Earl Smith.

The coach said it is "very doubtful" that Rodger Swedberg, 215-pound tackle will play at all. Center Bill van Buren and a reserve end, Frank Rigney, are also doubtful participants but apparently have more chance to play than Swedberg.

Palmer Won't Play  
Coach Red Sanders disclosed that his No. 1 linebacker, Steve Palmer, definitely will be out of action. Sophomore Jim Matheny, 197, will carry most of the load in Palmer's position.

Passing star Ronnie Knox apparently has recovered from a shoulder ailment and is ready to go "100 per cent all out."

# Alaska Area Hunting 'Hot'

FAIRBANKS, Alaska (AP) — An estimated 30,000 caribou migrating to new feeding grounds are crossing the Taylor highway during hunting season, and Alaska nimrods are having a field day.

Big Dean Works Out With Pads on Foot

Encouraging news floated through the Willamette University campus Thursday night as the school's football rosters learned that injured end Dean Benson may see some action against the Pacific U. Badgers at McCulloch Field Saturday night.

Benson has been sorely missed by the WU Bearcats, and is regarded as the team's best end. He suffered a cracked metatarsal, bone in the fore part of the foot, and has been out of action since the Oct. 2 Fresno State game.

He worked out with the squad Thursday night with his foot arch built up with padding, keeping weight off the fore part of his foot. Head coach Ted Ogdahl said Benson complained little of pain during the drill.

Definitely Won't Start  
The big end definitely won't start, but if past performances are any indication even a little action will be enough for Benson to break up the game.

Ogdahl said that the squad as a whole looked good and that Gerry Kangas, nursing a bruised knee, definitely would see some action in the 8 p.m. tussle.

The squad plans only a light drill today, with no pads, then will rest until game time. Scheduled to start are:

Ends, Vic Backlund and Keith Harris; tackles, Dave Anderson and Dale Greenlee; guards, Sam Haina and Gordon Chang; center, Chuck McClure.

Quarterback, Benny Holt; halfbacks, Windy Sequeira and Bobby Zoelch; fullback, George Koani.

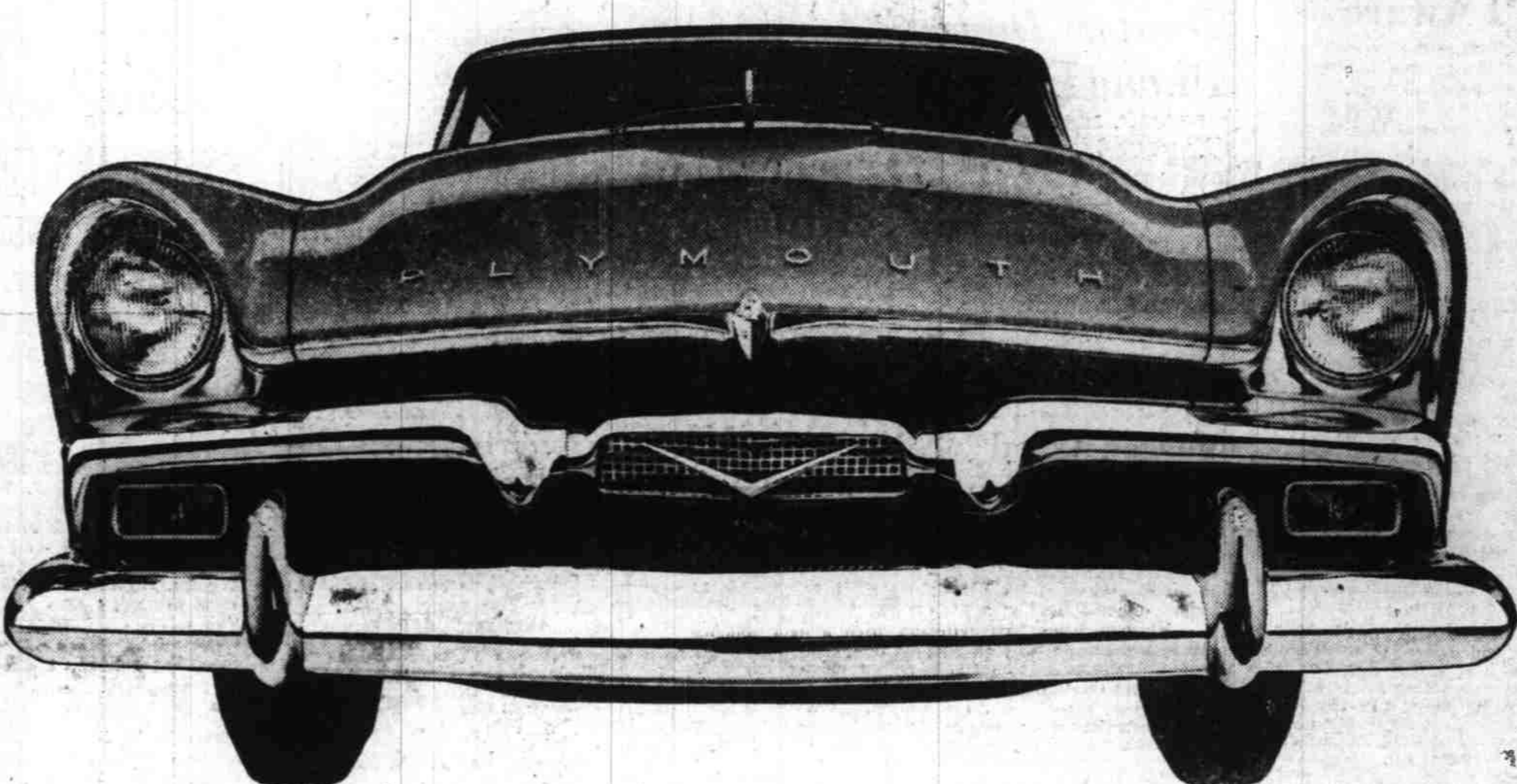

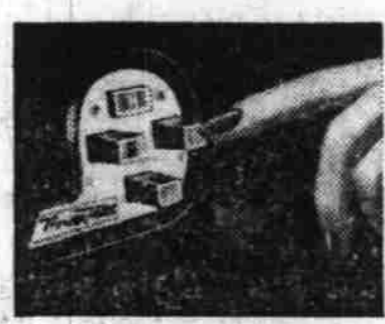

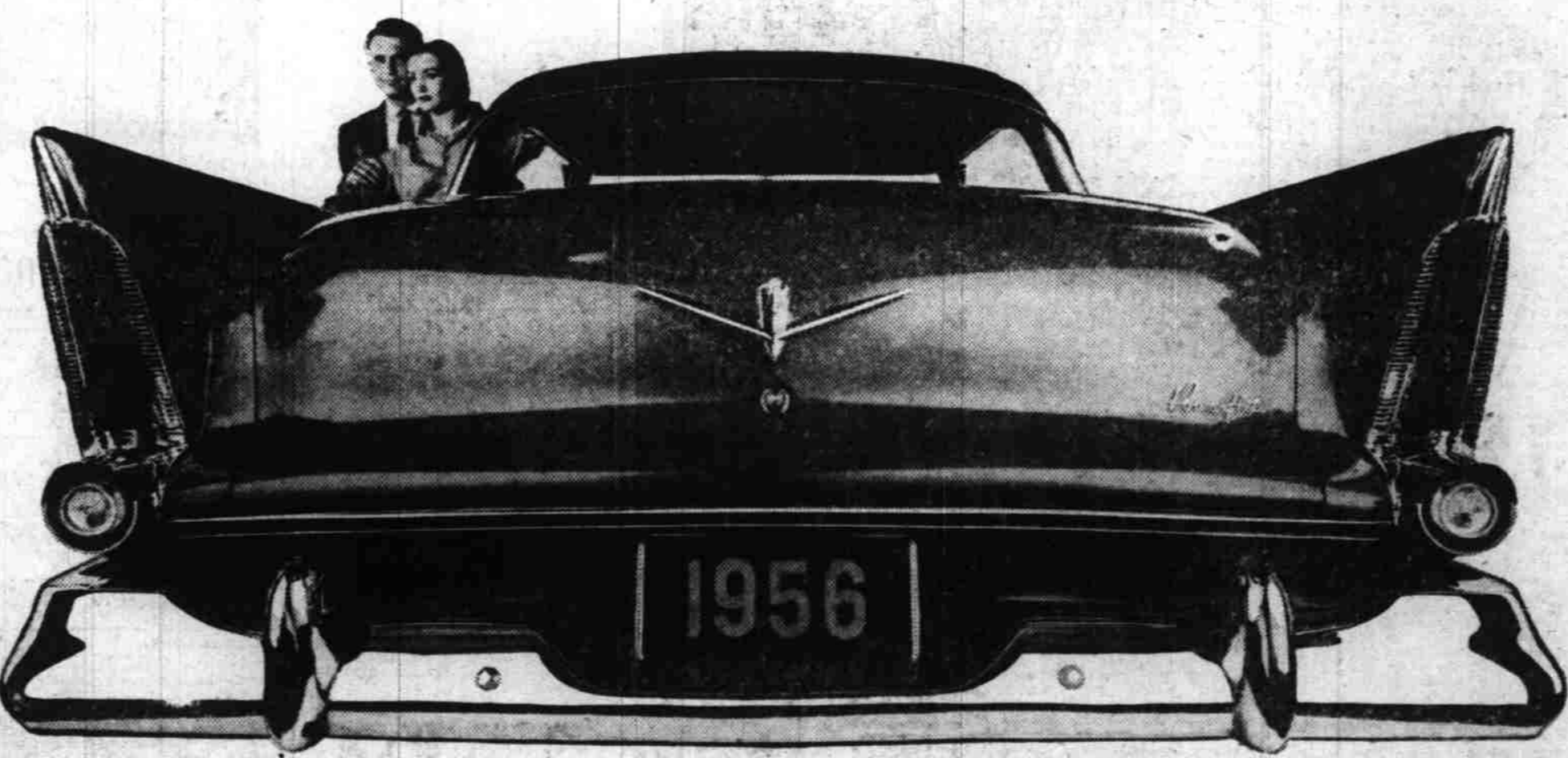
