Airline Chief Lashes CAB

SEATTLE — An airline president told a Senate subcommittee Wednesday he considered the Civil Aeronautics Board guilty of "irresponsible antics" in handling the problem of certifying air lines.

Arthur G. Woodley, president of Pacific Northern Airlines, told the subcommittee of the Senate Commerce and Foreign Affairs Committee that Alaska, which serves Alaska, "has been irreparably damaged by 'CAB antics.'"

Woodley's line received a five year extension of its certification by fly between Seattle-Portland and Anchorage last May after President Eisenhower ordered the board to act.

"As a result of the board's action over the years," Woodley charged, "the territory of Alaska and the carriers which provide its basic transportation facilities have been deprived of the sound economic development which Congress intended to foster and encourage."

The carriers, he said, "have been harassed by the board with an endless sequence of prolonged and costly public hearings which have failed to produce effective solutions to the basic problems involved."
