President Gets 'Sixth Star' For Good Hospital Behavior

DENVER (U)—President Eisenhower, who rose to the rank of five star general during 40 years in the Army, got a sixth star Saturday for "good behavior" as a hospital patient.

The new award was presented to him by the head of his medical team, Dr. Paul Dudley White of Boston, world famous heart specialist.

At a news conference after his latest examination of the President, White told newsmen that Eisenhower Saturday wore a pair of deep red pajamas which they—the newsmen—presented to him on his 65th birthday Oct. 15.

On both collar tabs are embroidered five gold stars in a circle, the symbol of the President's old Army rank, and embroidered across the pocket top is "Much better, thanks," a labor-saving idea designed to give the chief executive's visitors a quick report on his condition.

After reporting with a chuckle that the President was wearing the birthday pajamas with the five stars, White grinned and said: "I had the pleasure of pinning on a sixth star for good behavior."

300 Workers Strike Idaho Atomic Plant

IDAHO FALLS, Idaho (U)—Workers struck Saturday in support of a demand that they be paid for the time spent in traveling to and from the lonely area in which was developed the power unit for the world's first atomic submarine.

Seven separate facilities make up the Atomic Energy Commission's big installation on an Eastern Idaho desert. It employs a total of about 2,500 workers, of whom 300 are on strike.

Still operating at the AEC's national reactor testing station is the land-based engine which served as a prototype for the power plant built for the submarine Nautilus.

The strike was called by the CIO Oil, Chemical and Atomic Workers Union against Phillips Petroleum Co., operating contractor at three of the seven facilities.

A Phillips spokesman said the facilities were being kept in operation without the strikers and the AEC said the walkout had not affected other contractors at the station.

A spokesman for the Oil, Chemical and Atomic Workers Union at its headquarters in Denver said that workers spent an average of two hours' travel time in driving to and from the plant, located in the Lost River Desert about 45 miles west of Idaho Falls.

Reclamation Groups Probe Water Rights

LINCOLN, Neb. (U)—Two committees of the National Reclamation Assn. worked Saturday on proposed declarations that state water laws should be paramount.

The issue of states rights in control of the beneficial consumptive use of water within their boundaries came up in both the resolution and water policy committees.

These committees, the board of directors and other committees of the 17-state organization of back-ers of reclamation and irrigation met in preparation for the opening of the association's 24th annual convention here Monday.

The national water policy committee decided to propose a resolution on state water rights during its study of a proposed report disagreeing with a number of the recommendations on water resources and power made this year by the second Hoover commission.

Committee members said a recent U.S. Supreme Court decision in the Pelton Dam case from Oregon "establishes a dangerous precedent."

They said the case points to the urgent need for Congress to pass legislation making it clear that all federal agencies must comply with state water laws and that the rights of the states "shall not be imperiled by bureaucratic and federal control."

The water policy committee in its proposed 16-page report to the board of directors states that the Hoover commission stand on water resources and power "does not constitute an adequate basis for national water policy."

Montana Hit By Snow, Cold

A wintry cold front drove into Montana Saturday, toppling temperatures as much as 35 degrees under those of Friday and whipping snow over the central mountain area of the state.

A sharp contrast in temperature was reported at Lewistown, Mont., where the mercury slipped from Friday's 63 to 28 degrees, and light snow fell. There was only light snow on the ground in the Montana area, but Craig, Colo., measured 2 inches, and there was 4 inches on the ground at Mt. Washington, N.H.

Other low midday temperatures included Cut Bank, Mont., 26, compared with 58 Friday; and Great Falls, snow and 29 degrees, 31 points under a day earlier.

Cop \$50,000 Winner on Video Show

NEW YORK (U)—A Queens cop, Sgt. Barney Arluck, Saturday night won \$50,000 for answering two questions about jury selection on the NBC-TV program, "The Big Surprise."

Arluck, 43, said he would buy a house, take a Caribbean cruise with his wife, and put the rest in the bank.

Next week Arluck can try for \$100,000 — the top prize on the show. But even if he misses it, he can keep the \$50,000 he won tonight.

If a contestant misses a question during his rise to the big money, he is not eliminated. Arluck missed one last week when he was trying for \$50,000 the first time.

Under the somewhat complicated rules of the program, an electronic calculating machine was used to select a "duplicate" of Arluck—a man with a similar background.

This was Maj. Philip Loomis, also 43, of Bethesda, Md.

Loomis was asked one question: "What former eastern governor is a presidential aide?"

He correctly answered Sherman Adams, thus winning \$1,000 for himself and putting Arluck back in the running for the \$50,000 prize.

Arluck, who lives in Brooklyn and also is a lawyer, was asked to give three types of challenges of jurors under New York state law, and to list five of the eight provisions under which challenges are allowed.

Taxes on the \$50,000 were estimated at a little less than 50 per cent.
