Hefty 6-Year Old Taking After Father

CHARLESTON, W.Va. (AP)—Roger Mullins, you might say, is a chip off the old blockbuster.
At 6 years old, he stands 4 feet 5 and weighs 147 pounds.
His father, Newman Mullins, a trucking operator, has 302 pounds fairly well distributed on a 6 feet 2 frame.

The neighbors at Falling Rock in Kanawha County, near the capital city of Charleston, are all hands with homely aphorisms. Such as that chip off the old block business or "Roger is the spittin' image of his pa."

Roger's two brothers are not in the blockbuster category. Rex, 7, weighs 53 pounds and Creed, 4, about 35. Their mother is a comparative elf, standing 5 feet 4 and weighing only 100 pounds.

Newman Mullins says of his overweight son:
"He was a normal baby. Weighed eight pounds at birth. He started picking up right then and never quit."

Mrs. Mullins thinks the answer might be found at the family dining table. Roger, she says, eats as much as her other two sons combined.

He particularly loves meat of all kinds, apples and ice cream, and drinks two or three glasses of milk with each meal.
It takes two chickens to make a meal for the Mullins family, and Roger always gets all four drumsticks.

Newman Mullins was one of 13 children. His mother, Mrs. Amy Mullins, now 76, recalls:
"Newman was the biggest of my children. But he never was the size of Roger at that age. As I recollect, he weighed 110 pounds when he was seven or eight."

Salem Paving For 1955 Near Completion

The city of Salem's paving program for the year is all but finished, and city officials and citizens are already starting to make up the 1956 paving list.

One property owners' paving petition will be recommended for work in the 1956 program when Salem City Council takes up its semi-monthly business Monday night at City Hall.

City Engineer J. H. Davis has given his endorsement to a petitioner group asking that East street be paved between Garnet and 13th streets.

But another petitioning group

has so far been turned down for lack of enough of the affected property being represented on a petition for paving Bellevue between 19th and 21st.

Also up before the aldermen Monday night will be a proposed order for construction of a sidewalk along the east side of 23rd street, between State and Trade.

Other proposed orders concern sidewalk repairs on south side of Center street, in front of 1488 Center St.; on northwest corner of Saginaw and Kearney streets, at front of 895 Saginaw St.; at north-west corner of Saginaw and Owens

streets, in front of 1095 Saginaw. Still unsettled before the City Council is the proposed bill to permit City Transit Lines to change night bus service by shortening the routes.

Buffalo Man Aspen Music Festival Chief

ASPEN, Colo. (AP) — Izler Solomon, 45-year-old conductor of the Buffalo (N.Y.) Philharmonic, has been chosen concert director of the 1956 Aspen Music Festival.

Solomon, a native of St. Paul, Minn., currently is on tour as guest conductor of the Indianapolis Symphony. Previously he was on the music faculty of Michigan State College, musical director of the Lansing (Mich.) Symphony, leader of the Woman's Symphony of Chicago and director and conductor of the Columbus (Ohio) Philharmonic.

Army 'Solves' Tower Mystery

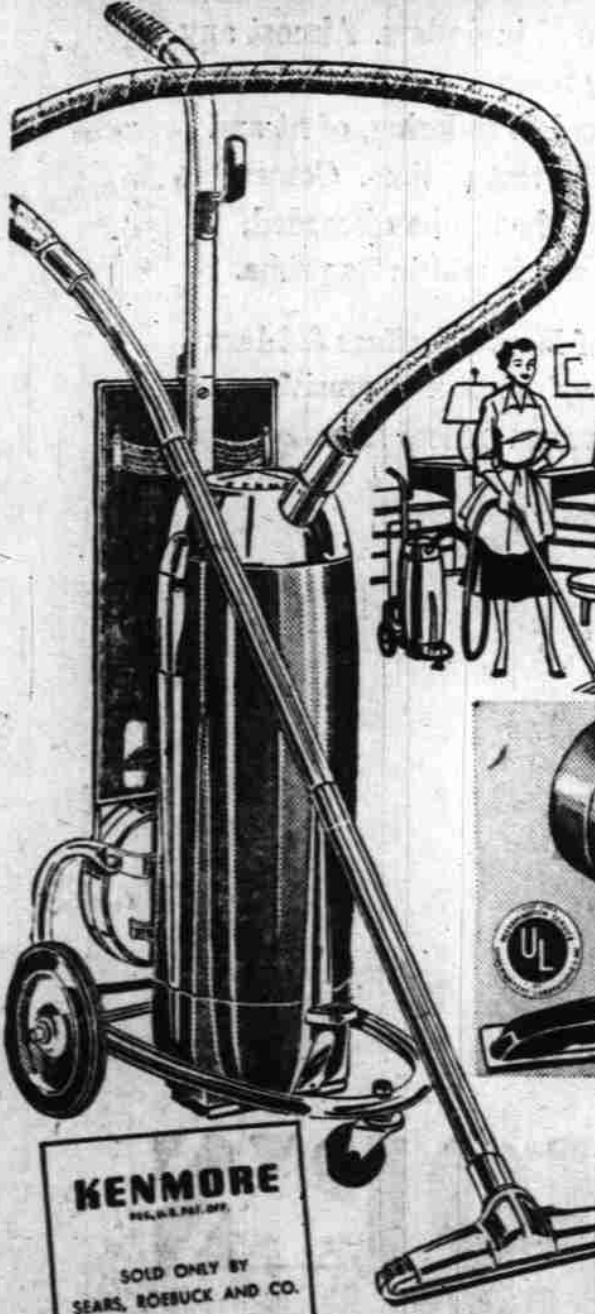

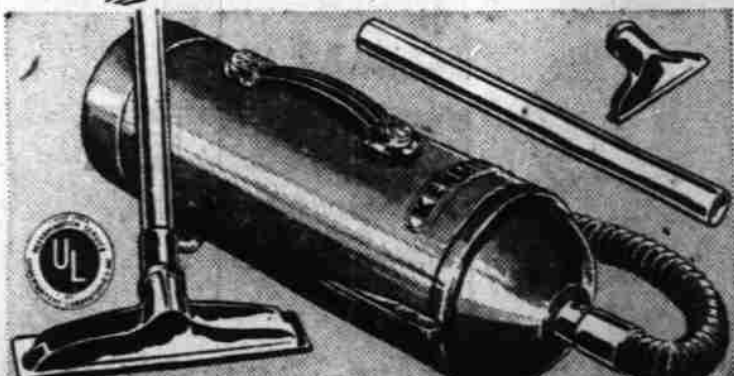

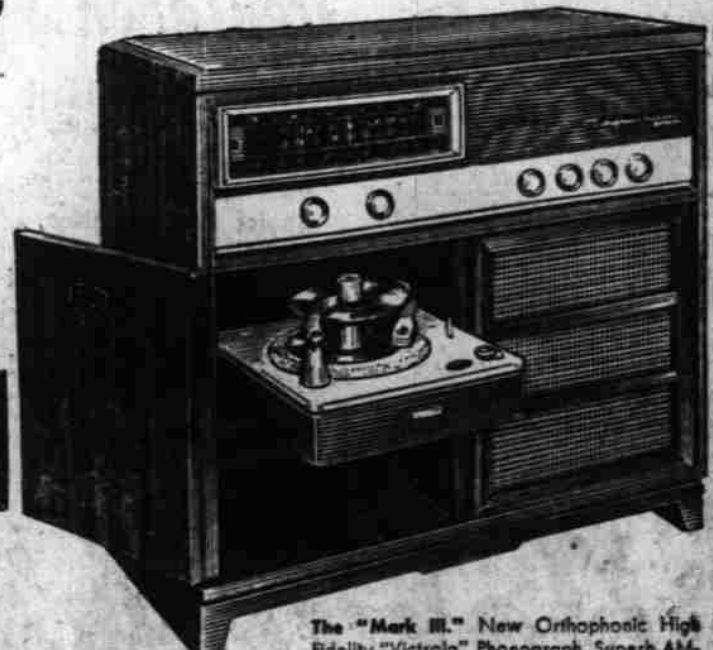
