Stock Market Turns Down

NEW YORK (U) — The stock market took a slight turn down in quiet trading Wednesday. The fall was far from pronounced and trading never reached proportions that would suggest pressure.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was off 40 cents at \$179.40. It was up 10 cents Tuesday. The industrial component of the average was off 60 cents, and the utilities were down 30 cents, while the railroads remained unchanged.

Business wasn't very great at 1,990,000 shares. That compares with 2,010,000 shares traded Tuesday. Both are well below the daily average of trading so far this year.
