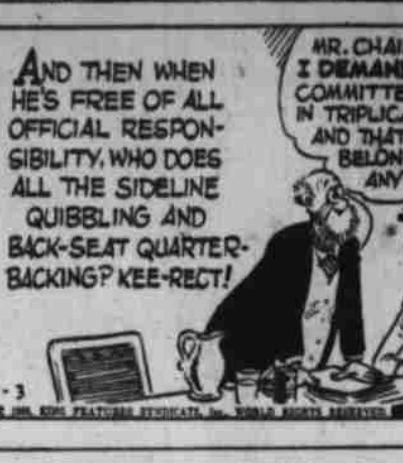
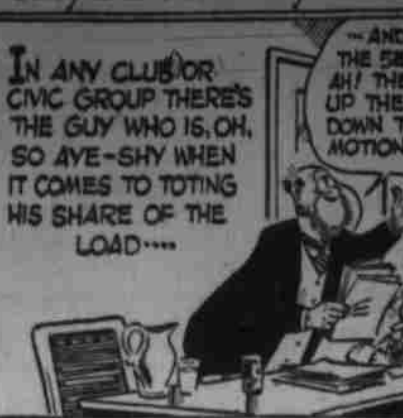

St. Nick's Promoters Face Helfand Charges

NEW YORK (AP)—State Athletic Commissioner Julius Helfand aimed specific charges Thursday at promoters of the Monday night televised fights at St. Nicholas Arena and announced continuing disintegration of the New York Managers Guild.

Eight specific charges were brought against Tex Sullivan, matchmaker, and Willie Gilzenberg, treasurer, of the London Sporting Club and seven charges against the corporation itself.

He ordered Sullivan and Gilzenberg to appear before the commission Jan. 19 to show cause why their licenses as promoters in New York should not be revoked.

The main charges were that Sullivan and Gilzenberg associated with known criminals and, in attempting to move their enterprise to Baltimore last week, sought to hamper the State Athletic Commission's efforts.

Helfand's office at the same time announced that 29 members of the once-defiant New York Managers Guild had resigned and more withdrawals were expected.

Among those to leave the body, which Helfand had ordered banned effective Jan. 15, were Willie Ketchum, manager of ex-lightweight champion, Jimmy Carter, Bobby Gleason who handles Cuban heavyweight contender Nino Valdes, Hymie Wallman, Jimmy DeAngelo and Jimmy White.

Counsel Permitted

In calling a hearing on the charges against Sullivan and Gilzenberg, Helfand said the two men would be permitted to bring counsel and call witnesses as in a court trial. This was not permitted in the commission's probe of the managers guild last year.

"We feel sure we've done nothing wrong," said Sullivan, speaking for himself and Gilzenberg, "and there's nothing in the charge we're afraid to answer. We'll be glad to appear and give the public our side of the story."

The two main charges made by Helfand Thursday were:

1. That the licensees of the London Sporting Club "during 1955 and January of 1956 consorted with bookmakers, gamblers and persons of similar pursuits."

Subterfuge Charged

2. That Sullivan and Gilzenberg moved their enterprise to Baltimore "as a subterfuge to enable the New York Managers Guild to circumvent and sabotage the efforts of the State Athletic Commission in barring the guild."

Helfand issued an edict Dec. 12 that all members of the Boxing Guild of New York, a unit of the International Boxing Guild, should resign their association with that body effective Jan. 15.

The guild voted unanimously to defy the order, but its resistance was broken when Jim Norris, president of the International Boxing Club, and Al Weill, manager of heavyweight champion Rocky Marciano, announced they would cooperate with the commission.

Fishing Report:

NORTHWEST

Tillamook, Neetsucca, Salmon river steelhead angling has been generally quiet for a few days. Prospects for the weekend are poor to fair though drifting on larger streams may improve. Steelhead angling should be fair by this weekend on Lincoln county streams if no further heavy rains are experienced. Rivers are beginning to drop and clear up. The Sandy is low and clear; steelhead angling has been fair to good. Fishing has been slow on the rocky waters of the Clackamas. Eagle creek, a Clackamas tributary, has provided fair angling in the area below the winter dam.

SOUTHWEST

Steelhead angling is fair to good in both forks on the Millicoma river. Better angling is expected in west fork as it will clear within a day and night of clear weather. Steelhead angling is poor in all forks of Coquille river and there must be at least three days of clear weather before it will be fishable. Striped bass angling is poor to fair in Isthmus slough. Steelhead angling in Tenuille lake outlet is slow. Water is clear but high and should improve if rain stops and water drops. Steelhead angling in the Umpqua system is slow to fair throughout most of central Douglas county. Snow runoff is keeping the streams very roily, but cold weather is holding them at a moderate level. Water temperatures are in the high thirties.

Streams in Willows county are dropping and clearing. Steelhead angling should improve on the lower Grande Ronde and Imnaha rivers. The John Day river at Kimberly is producing fair steelhead catches. The upper John Day is clearing and angling should improve if cold weather continues. The Umatilla river has been murky. The Columbia river is high and roily.

from 1902 to 1923, many against men who greatly outweighed him. Officially he was classified as a welterweight.

Sam's greatest ring weight was only 162½ yet he battled, and beat, many a heavyweight. And in 1906, when he lost a close 15-round decision in nearby Chelsea to Jack Johnson—the same Johnson who later was to rule as world heavyweight titlist—Sam weighed a mere 145.

Sam's only source of income was a trust fund set up by the New York Herald Tribune at the instigation of that paper's sports writer, Al Laney, after Langford was found blind and in dire circumstances in a frigid, cheerless room in New York's Harlem.

After stories of the tar baby's plight appeared on the country's sports pages, boxing fans contributed to a fund which reportedly grew to \$10,000.

Sam, a Weymouth, N. S., native had no immediate relatives.

Jockey Dies After Tumble

SAN DIEGO, Calif. (AP)—Brain injuries brought death Thursday to jockey LeRoy Nelson, 18, who was hurled from his horse in a race at Agua Caliente, Mexico, Sunday.

The young jockey, who had ridden more than 200 winners in his short career, never regained consciousness.

His bride of last June, Sherry Nelson, 18, was at his bedside until the end. She saw the accident, in which a horse fell with a broken leg. Her husband's, Goldie H, stumbled over the fallen animal.

Mrs. Nelson disclosed that her husband had been struck at the base of the brain, apparently by the horse's knee, and in the forehead by a hoof.

Famed Austria Ski Meet Set

Olympic Hopes
Eye Busy Weekend

KITZBUHEL, Austria (AP)—Olympic hopefuls from 22 nations tuned up for the big Hahnekamm international downhill and slalom Americans, after a threat to withdraw, were rated among the favorites.

Hahnekamm, one of the oldest and most famed annual ski competitions in Europe, has a record entry of 190 because this is an Olympic year. It also is the final competitive preview of the 1956 winter Olympic games, which open Jan. 26 at Cortina d'Ampezzo, Italy.

Twisting Run

Most of the 30 Olympic teams are here for the competition for men and women skiers in downhill races Saturday and the slalom — a twisting downhill run through a series of restraining gates — on Sunday.

The host country Austria's skiers are odds-on favorites in the men's competition after their sweep at Wengen, Switzerland, last week-end.

Among Best

But two rated among the best bets to break the Austrian monopoly are Ralph Miller, American downhill racer from Hanover, N. H., and Japan's Chiharu (Chick) Igaya, who got his training in that same New Hampshire village as a Dartmouth student.

American Coach Robert (Bob) Sheehan of Middlebury, Vt., threatened to pull his team out of the downhill competition Wednesday because of a dangerous track.

But Thursday he described it as "fairly safe."

Washington Rebel Goes to Seattle

SEATTLE (AP)—Mike Monroe, a leader among those who revolted against football Coach John Cherberg at the University of Washington in November, left the school for turfless pastures this week.

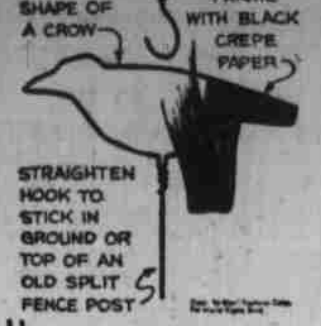
He moved across town and enrolled at Seattle University, noted for its top basketball teams but never represented on the gridiron.
