Board to Open Interstate Bridge Bids

Sealed bids for construction of the new \$8,250,000 interstate bridge over the Columbia River between Portland and Vancouver, Wash., will be opened by the State Highway Commission at a meeting in Portland March 1. State Highway Engineer R.H. Baldock announced Thursday.

Upon completion of the new bridge the existing bridge will be demolished. The new bridge will carry northbound traffic on the Pacific highway while the existing bridge will carry southbound traffic.

Construction of the new bridge will be supervised by the Oregon Highway Commission. The Washington Toll Bridge Authority will collect the tolls and handle financing in connection with the construction of both bridges. Baldock said the new bridge would be 3,331 feet in length and will provide a 40-foot roadway and five-foot sidewalk.
