

Annexation of 50-Acre Site To City Backed by Planners

Annexation of a 50-acre area at Salem's west city limits on Kingwood Heights was recommended Tuesday night by Salem Planning Commission.

This is the second time the planners have endorsed the proposal to bring a Lowen Avenue subdivision

and adjacent territory into the city. Property developers dropped the idea last year, revived it again recently.

The recommendation came over the objection of one property owner, C. L. Gilmer, whose 3 1/2-acre property is included in the area. He told the commission he was not ready to subdivide and felt his

property would not gain from the annexation.

Complication Seen

His property is at southeast corner of the larger area. Planners said they felt leaving the corner out would complicate city boundaries there.

The commission also took action to recommend extension of the South 12th Street business zone into three lots between Rural and Lewis streets, in connection with proposed location of a new Erickson supermarket on South 12th.

Citizens, Chamber View County Juvenile Issue

Riots Against Nehru Flare In West India

BOMBAY, India (U) — Violent, burning rebellion erupted Tuesday and blazed through the night in Western India against Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru.

Rioters representing millions of Indians held Nehru personally responsible for the new decision making Bombay a city apart from surrounding rival states.

"Death to Nehru" was the slogan chanted and borne on placards in a night of terror, death and destruction. Political observers said the situation was the worst since the British jailed Gandhi and Nehru in wartime.

Rioters Under Fire

Police fired on rioters here and elsewhere in Western India. At midnight six persons were officially reported dead.

Fires broke out in many parts of this port city of three million people, India's largest.

The basic problem that has led to death and destruction is, like that of Babel, the confusion of languages.

Ike May Be Getting Funds Eyed for Adlai

The letters came from 141 West Jackson Blvd., Chicago 4. The Adirondack Enterprise telephoned the Stevenson headquarters in Chicago, got the explanation Tuesday that the mix-up occurred in a mailing house. About 400 mishaps are believed to have been mailed.

Corrections are in the works, the newspaper was told.

Slide Victims' Fund Grows

ROSEBURG (U) — The fund being collected for three children, who survived an earth slide at Remote that killed five members of their family, now totals \$2,240.

The children, Margaret Elaine Neal, 13, and her brothers, Alvis, 8, and Billy, 6, are living with their maternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Robbins, Riddle.

The children's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Marion Neal, two sisters and a brother, were killed when a wave of mud shattered their house the day after Christmas.

State Solon Says AFL Vote Record Errs

PORTLAND (U) — The AFL compilation of voting records at the 1955 Legislature contains a "complete falsehood," State Sen. John P. Housell of Hood River said Tuesday.

Housell is one of seven Republican senators who the State Federation of Labor considers to have voted "wrong" more often than "right."

The others are Sens. Donald Husband, Eugene; Philip Lowry, Medford; Lee Ohmart, Salem; George Ulett, Coquille; Gene Brown, Grants Pass; and Senate President Elmo Smith, John Day.

Housell said the compilation listed him as voting against S.B. 7—which the AFL said was a "measure which made Portland State College a degree-granting institution."

Housell said S.B. 7 actually was a measure to increase the minimum salary that school boards are allowed to pay teachers.

"S.B. 1 was the bill that made Portland State College a full-fledged member of the state system. I was one of the sponsors . . . and supported it," Housell said.

Ike to Address GOP Rallies

WASHINGTON (U) — President Eisenhower will address "Salute to Eisenhower" Republican rallies throughout the country Friday night — his first political speech since his September heart attack.

The chief executive may address the \$100-a-plate dinner rally here in person, with his remarks carried to similar funds raising affairs in other cities by closed circuit television and radio.

Or he may not attend the Washington dinner, but speak to the rallies from the White House.

Radio and television networks will be permitted to pick up the 8 to 10 minute speech and carry it on a live basis to the country generally.

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Ike Supports Cost-Sharing Water Policy

WASHINGTON (U) — President Eisenhower Tuesday endorsed a proposal by a cabinet committee that interests which benefit from federal water resources developments share the cost in proportion to their benefits.

The government would pay for benefits which are "national and widespread."

But the committee expressed the opinion in its report — with which the president generally concurred — that "in most instances direct identifiable beneficiaries should pay a larger share of the cost for benefits received than they do now."

A second principal recommendation was that a new post of coordinator of water resources be established in the president's executive office, and that a board of review be set up, independent of federal agencies, to analyze the engineering and economic feasibility of water development projects.
