

### Action Eyed Against Thefts Of Cameras

Camera stores and photo studios are considering joint action and new methods to combat shoplifting and bad check losses, according to Walter W. Morse, Salem, president of Columbia Empire division, Master Photo Dealers and Finishers Association.

Officers of the association reported their study of the situation to members at a weekend meeting in Eugene. Their tentative plans call for a system of notifying each other when shoplifters are active, and for encouraging public acceptance of use of a thumb-print machine routinely to identify persons paying by check.

The notice system would be in cooperation with police agencies. It is prompted by recent rounds of shoplifting where similar photographic equipment was taken from several stores within a few days.

At the Eugene meeting Morse was reelected president and another Salem man, Henry J. Millie, was elected secretary-treasurer.

### Dallas Group Hears Speech By Hitchcock

DALLAS — Philip S. Hitchcock, Republican candidate for the United States Senate, warned an audience here Monday night that "lightrope between liberty and security" is becoming increasingly difficult to walk.

The former state senator from Klamath Falls spoke at the annual Boss's Night dinner of the Dallas Business and Professional Women's Club, held at the City Hall.

Hitchcock, who is currently director of Church and Public Relations at Lewis and Clark College, Portland, entered the Republican primary race last week following the death of Gov. Paul Patterson whom he had supported.

"We who govern ourselves must always walk a tightrope between liberty and our search for security," Hitchcock said. "That tightrope always becomes more difficult to walk in times of crisis such as we are experiencing today."

### W. M. Byrkit, 64, Succumbs

SUBLIMITY — William Martin Byrkit, 64, who had lived in the Shaw and Sublimity areas in recent years, died Sunday at a Stayton hospital.

Byrkit has resided here for the past two years and prior to that was a farmer in the Shaw sector for some five years. He was born Aug. 8, 1891, in Clay County, Neb.

He was a member of the American Legion and the Disabled American Veterans organization. Funeral services are set for 1:30 p.m. Friday at Weddle Mortuary in Stayton. Rev. Clyde Freeman will officiate and interment will follow at Lone Oak Cemetery at Stayton.

### Man Faces Drunk Charge

Investigation of a family disturbance early Monday morning resulted in the arrest of a Salem man on charges of drunkenness and carrying a concealed weapon, city police report.

Officers said Bud Harrell, 1393 N. Commercial St., was fined \$20 on the drunk count and committed to jail in lieu of payment. Provision was made for dismissal of the concealed weapons charge when the fine is paid, police said. The man, arrested near his home, was charged with carrying a concealed weapon after a switch-blade knife was found in a pocket, according to officers.

### Larceny Charge Brings Guilty Plea

Wesley Lee Norris, a former Salem resident, waived grand jury hearing Monday and pleaded guilty before Marion County Circuit Court Judge George Duncan to a charge of larceny.

The 29-year-old former instructor at the Arthur Murray Dance Studio admitted taking an adding machine and typewriter from the studio.

Judge Duncan, however, set aside sentencing Norris pending a report from a pre-sentence investigation.

### Pedestrian Asks \$15,500

A \$15,500 personal injury suit was filed in Marion County Circuit Court Monday for damages allegedly incurred in an accident involving a pedestrian and automobile on North Capitol Street Jan. 4.

Filing the suit is Rosa Sue Porter whose complaint names Leona Mae Killinger as the driver of the car. The plaintiff seeks \$500 specific damages to pay for what she alleges were doctor and medical expenses. The \$15,000 is for general damages, the complaint asserts.

### Paperboard Mill Planned For Toledo

NEW YORK — Georgia-Pacific Plywood Co. is entering the paper producing industry through the formation of a subsidiary, which will build a 90,000-ton kraft and paperboard mill at Toledo, Ore., it was announced Monday.

Industry sources say such a plant would cost between 20 and 25 million dollars.

Owen R. Cheatham, president of Georgia-Pacific, said the subsidiary would be known as Georgia-Pacific Paper Co. and would have its headquarters in Portland, Ore.

Cheatham announced the election of H. Stuart Daniels as president of Georgia-Pacific Paper. Daniels, currently president of the Kraft Paper Assn., has resigned as executive vice president and general sales manager of Union Bag & Paper Corp. to take the post.

### South Salem Club Opposes Zone Change

Members of the South Salem Progress Club Monday night voted disapproval of a proposed zone change at Kearney and High streets.

The zone change has been sought to permit construction of a medical clinic at the southwest corner of the intersection.

Lewis Judson, president of the South Salem group, talked on early days in Oregon. Some 33 persons attended the meeting, held at Franz' bakery, 1220 S. 20th St.

### 2 Burglaries Investigated

Two weekend burglaries of private residences were investigated Monday by Marion County Sheriff's deputies.

One entry was made sometime between 4 p.m. Sunday and Monday morning by breaking through the glass of a rear door of the H. G. Brock home at 2680 Bluff St. An undetermined number of fire arms, whisky and possibly a film projector were taken, the sheriff's office reported.

The other burglary occurred between 1:30 and 10:10 p.m. Sunday at the home of Ernest E. Weiss, 630 E. Vista St. A kitchen window was forced and loot that included wine, whisky, two fishing poles and reels, and both male and female clothing was taken.
