Sojourners is an organization aimed at helping women, new to the capital city of Oregon, make friends and become acquainted with the com-

munity.

The group holds dessert luncheons and card parties twice a month at the Salem Woman's Club, with as many as 75 attending. Other social affairs augment the calendar during the year and include two dances, no-host dinner parties and a picnic in the summer.

Members represent all parts of Oregon, the Northwest and many other states. Members may maintain their membership as long as desired, but can only hold office the first two years. Membership is by invitation and newcomers are sponsored by a member.

Sojourners was organized eleven years ago by nine women, six of whom still reside in Salem. Friendliness is the keynote of the group and a constant stream of new arrivals keeps the ranks filled. There is a frequent turnover of membership as members begin to feel "at home" in Salem and other activities lead members to other interests.
