Steelhead Fishing Again at Slow Stage

Steelhead fishing has slowed down quite some and no little the past few days with plenty of snow water putting the chill on things, including the fish. The lower Sandy has produced a few bright fish but in general the steelhead fishing has been poor. A few spring Chinook have been taken from the mouth of the Clackamas where there is a bit of clear water but the number of fish taken in ratio to the number of anglers has been low.

Only bright spot on the angling picture is the ocean fishing. Anglers are enjoying surf fishing and jetty-jumping for ling cod, perch ind rock bass. A few flounders are also being taken in the bays at Nestucca, Siletz, and Yaquina. Best bet for perch is the surf of Pacific City. Light surg tackle makes the perch fishing quite a sport. Then there is the anticipation which goes along with it. One never lows when some stray fish from the deep may come along and swim off with your outfit.

We recall a surf fishing trip a few years ago in California when our ever-loving fishin' wife went along with us to show us how to eatch stripers. 


