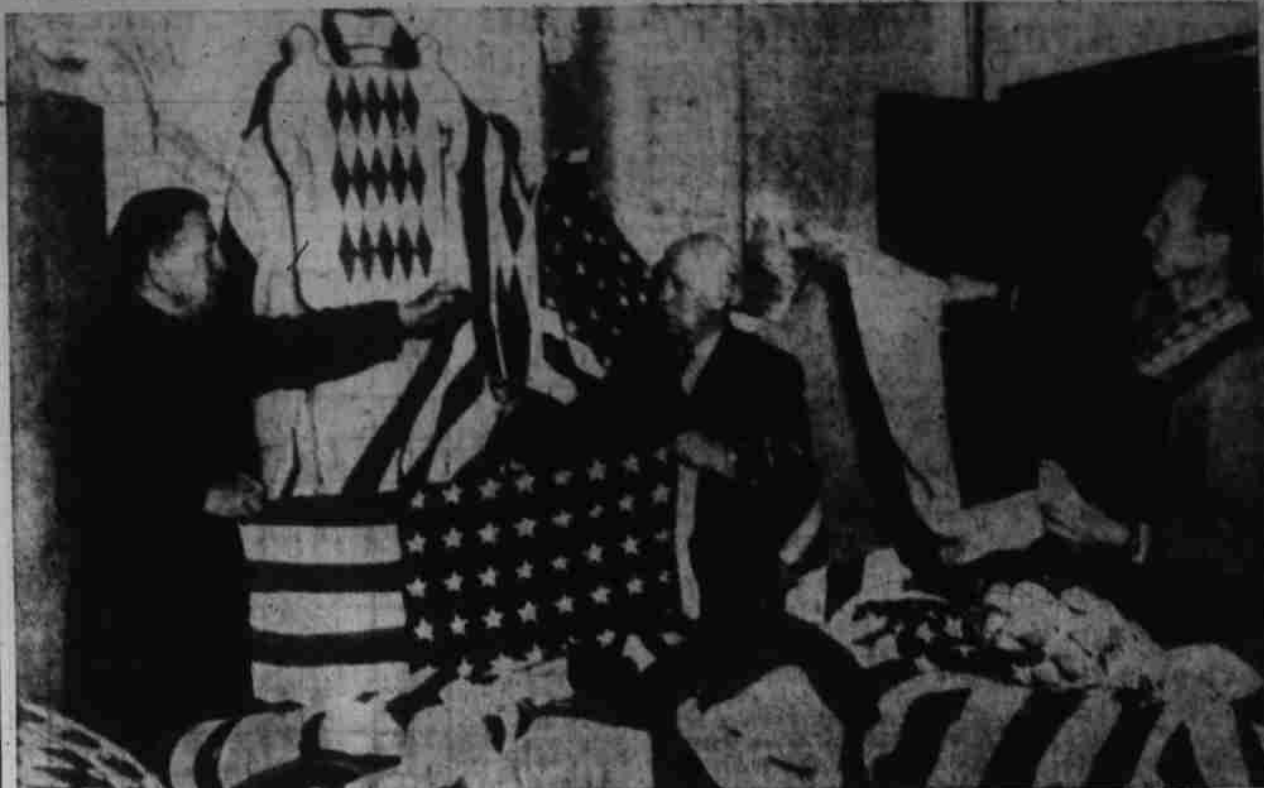


Monaco Breaks Out U.S. Flags

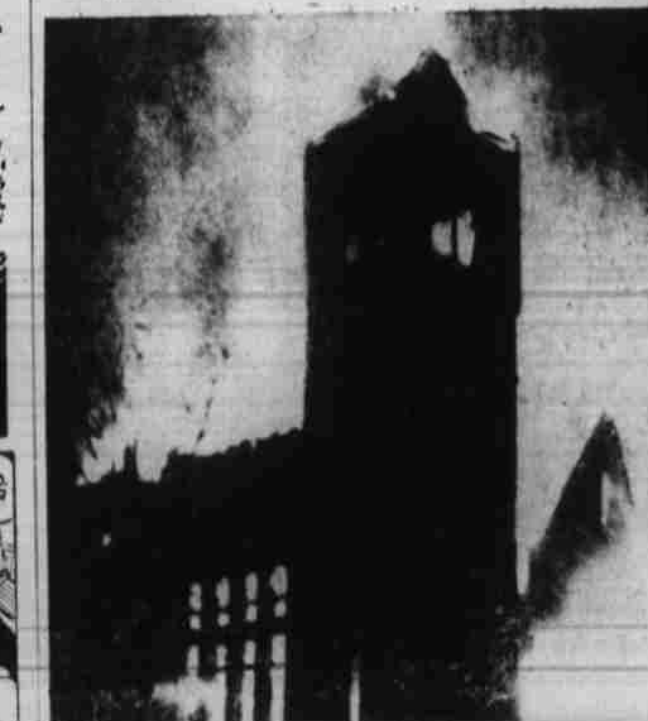

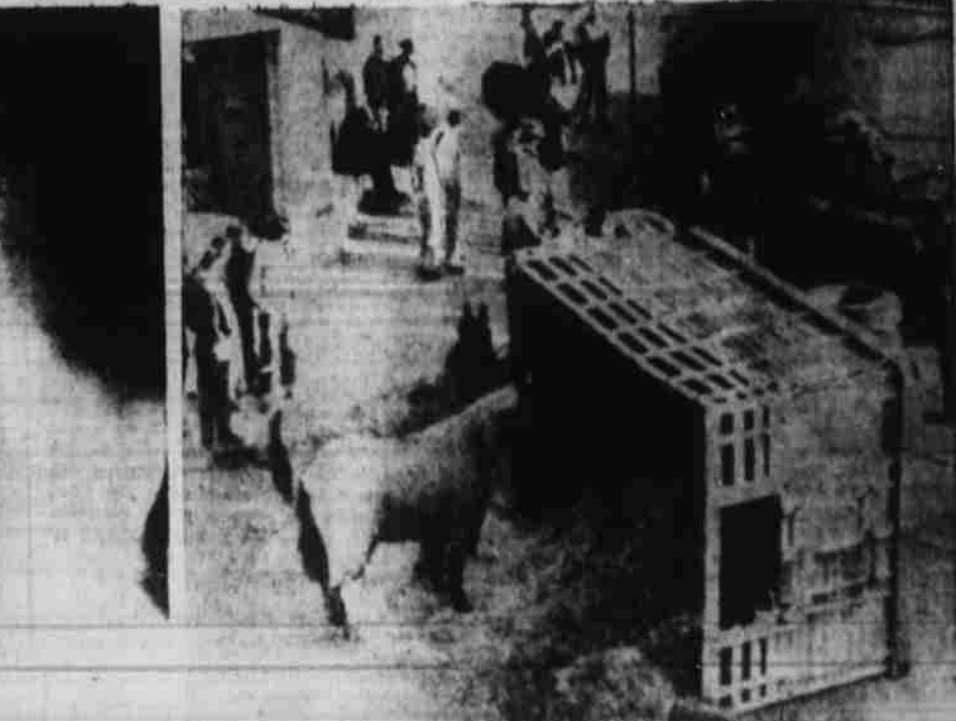
