

House Okehs \$13 Million Fund For Willamette Valley Air Base

A thirteen-and-a-half-million dollar authorization for the proposed Willamette Valley Air Force Base passed the House Thursday, according to Associated Press.

Part of a two-billion-dollar military construction bill approved by 377 of the 380 representatives voting, it now goes to the Senate. The bill is an authorization measure for money to be appropriated in later legislation. The program is for the year beginning July 1.

Announcement of the site of the \$13,500,000 base, with an area west of Woodburn believed to be favored, is expected this month. The Air Force Installations Board in Washington, D. C., was reported to have it under consideration.

Arabs, Israel Claim Air Wins, Vow Defense Fight

JERUSALEM (AP) — Israeli and Egyptian jet planes battled Thursday high over the Holy Land. Israel claimed one and possibly two enemy planes shot down. Egypt said one Israeli plane was blasted from the skies in this first aerial combat of 1956.

One Egyptian jet crashed 20 miles inside Israel, an Israeli military spokesman said. The pilot, Mohammed Latif, was quoted as saying his plane was on a patrol mission. He was taken to a hospital with head and leg injuries.

21-Gun Salute Fired When Grace Docks

MONTE CARLO (AP) — The arrival of film star Grace Kelly here Thursday for her wedding next week to Prince Rainier III was a jubilant spectacle.

Overhead circled planes and helicopters, most carrying photographers. But from one, shipping magnate Aristotle Onassis, owner of a big share of Monte Carlo's famed gambling casino, tossed blossoms.

A 21-gun salute was fired from the thick walls of Monaco's ancient fortress, rockets were fired to release flags and balloons, and the sirens shrieked on boats in the harbor.

The yacht flew both Rainier's banner, a golden crown on a white field, and the Stars and Stripes when it returned to shore.

Rarely had Grace passed through the palace gates and made a brief appearance with Rainier on one of his balconies for the happy, flag-waving crowd when clouds blotted out the sun.

Friends reported later that in the palace Grace succumbed to emotional excitement and wept briefly but quickly regained the high spirits she had shown in the morning.

Early in the evening, Rainier left the palace to go to his villa at nearby St. Jean-Cap-Ferrat where he will stay until after he and Grace are married next Thursday by the Bishop of Monaco. Custom requires that he should not remain at night under the same roof with his fiancée.

11,000 View Science Show

Some of the marvels of science which may change their lives were seen Thursday by an estimated 11,000 visitors to the General Motors Parade of Progress. It was the first full day's performance of the traveling circus of science.

Included in that number were 2,400 youngsters who attended special morning school showings at 9:30 a.m. and 10 a.m. Slightly over 4,000 persons viewed the show Wednesday.

The exposition is set up at Bank's Pasture Park. Daily performances will be given from 2 to 10 p.m. through Sunday. There is no admission charge.

Mosquito Now Aiding Mankind In Food Tests

DALLAS, Tex. (AP) — The pesky mosquito now is helping mankind in insecticide tests.

Dr. L. C. Terriere and Ulo Klugevski of the Oregon State College Agricultural Experiment Station in Corvallis reported Thursday to the American Chemical Society on how they use the mosquitoes to check food purity, determining whether any harmful amounts of insecticide are left on produce.

Terriere explains the mosquito can detect microscopically small amounts of insecticides which cannot be picked up by chemical tests. So mosquitoes are bred and exposed to samples to determine the amount.

Seven Killed as 10-Gallon Bottle of Cologne Explodes

PLASENCIA, Spain (AP) — A 10-gallon bottle of eau de cologne exploded here Thursday. Seven persons died in the resulting fire and collapse of a three-story building.

Police said the bottle of cologne was in a closed storeroom. Evidently a short circuit generated enough heat to cause the inflammable liquid to explode. The blast set the building on fire. The victims were trapped inside.

Two Cleared In Beating; One Guilty

WOODBURN — Two young persons charged in a gang beating of a 14-year-old Woodburn girl last Friday were found innocent Thursday in Woodburn Justice Court. A third pleaded guilty to assault and battery but sentencing was delayed pending further investigation.

Alven Becker, 19, of Woodburn, and Hazel Graham, 18, of Silverton, pleaded not guilty and were found innocent in a trial conducted by Justice of the Peace Harold Eichsteadt. Mary Ann Stubbfield, 18, of Silverton, pleaded guilty.

Two younger boys and three younger girls are charged with assault and battery in the same beating on Woodburn Justice Court warrants. Their cases will be handled in juvenile court.

Charges were based on a complaint signed by Mrs. John Foltz, mother of Shirley Foltz, who reportedly received minor injuries in the beating which is said to have taken place on Boone's Ferry Road about a half mile north of Woodburn.

2 Boys Admit Candy Theft

Two boys aged 14 and 15 admitted Thursday to entering Wilamette Grocery Co. three times in an evening and later breaking a seal on a boxcar, Salem police said.

The boys said they made three trips to the grocery warehouse at Trade and South Cottage Streets March 23 to carry away several bags of candy Easter eggs and jelly beans, a large box of hard candy and several cans of tomato juice and tuna fish, police said.

They also broke into a box car in the 700 block Trade Street Sunday, but, finding it filled with grapefruit, took nothing, according to their statement to police.

PORTLAND (AP) — A small boy saw his playmate jump into an empty garbage can here Thursday, and jump right out again. Then David Wais, 8, tried it. He wasn't as thin as his friend.

Neighbors called the fire department and firemen freed David from the can.

Fire Strikes Salem Home Second Time

Salem firemen and police are investigating a fire which severely damaged an unoccupied Salem home early Thursday morning. It was the second time in less than a week that a fire had broken out in the house.

Firemen were called about 1:35 a.m. after a neighbor spotted the blaze in the residence of Frank Joseph Walworth Jr., 1570 N. Winter St. The fire apparently started in two different places at about the same time, firemen said.

One blaze started in the living room wall area, Fire Marshall Glenn Shedeck said. The second fire started in the upper part of the front bedroom. Damage to the home was estimated at \$2,500 to \$3,000, in addition to damage to furniture.

Saturday's fire started in the living room, destroyed a chair, burned a hole in the floor and caused considerable damage to the wall, Shedeck said.

The Walworth's have not been living in the home since Saturday's fire, neighbors said. Cause of the fires was undetermined.
