Marilyn's Face, Figure Adorn Atom Submarine

WASHINGTON (AP)—The face and figure of Marilyn Monroe ride in a pin-up photograph aboard the world's first known atomic submarine, the U. S. Navy's Nautilus.

Lt. Cmdr. John H. Ebersole, former medical officer of the Nautilus, related this today in describing a radiation control laboratory aboard the sub.

He said the compartment has a floor space only six by three feet—with room for "only two people, three if friendly"—but, "Even so, there's still room for the inevitable pin-up pictures."

"I came into the room one day, and there on a wall chart of the elements—in the space ordinarily showing elements 60 to 92—was a picture of Marilyn Monroe."

Top Echelon Praise Given 'The Sarong'

HOLLYWOOD — STARR REPORT: Dorothy Lamour has done very little television since the medium came along, but her opening night at the Hotel Statler's Terrace Room here in Los Angeles, packed with critics, stars and such top echelon television and motion picture brass as is seldom seen among the first nights, proved that she is more than ready. And without a sarong in sight, either.

She was introduced by Liberace, who was there with his entire family, and opened the show with a special number, "Be My Guest." It was a pleasure. She has a seemingly effortless ability to capture and control her audience. Never bawdy, always lovely and charming, Dorothy can burn up all her sarongs



and be an asset to any bigtime TV show. Given a format like Perry Como's, she can hold down an hour of her own.

Bob Hope came on for a brief bit of reminiscing about the old "Road" pictures. Mitch Leisen was chortling about the praise for the "new" dress he had designed for Dorothy. "I made it over from one of her old ones," he chuckled. And a highlight was accompanist Sam Mingo's own concerto, "California Rhapsody." Talk about a small world—Sam turned out to be an old high school friend of mine from Buffalo and today lives next door to Liberace. And as a gesture to his next-door neighbor, Sam played his rhapsody dressed in a sequined jacket and with a miniature candelabra on the piano. Looking straight at Lee, who was enjoying it all hugely, Sam said, "And I have a white one for Saturday nights."

THERE'S A YOUNG new Irish tenor hereabouts, name of Sean Monaghan, who could be another Morton Downey or Dennis Day and who currently has his own five-a-week quarter-hour show on KBJ-TV here in Los Angeles. He's tall and lean with Irish black hair and Irish blue eyes and an Irish brogue thick enough to make a pair of shoes out of. At 28, he still looks 21. He arrived from Ireland in 1949, has six brothers and sisters, plays an excellent game of golf (shoots in the 60's when he's hot and is very careful not to be too hot when playing with his boss).

FRANKIE LAINE HAS helped make a dream come true for his long-time friend and arranger-accompanist, the late Carl Fisher, who died just two years ago. Fisher had spent no less than 15 years writing an orchestral suite, "Reflection of an Indian Boy," finishing it very shortly
