

Israel to Unveil Jets, Parade Arms Might Before Dag's Visit

TEL AVIV, Israel (U) — Israel will parade its military power on Sunday ahead of U.N. secretary general Dag Hammarskjöld's official visit.

The eighth anniversary of Israel's independence will be celebrated throughout the land. But

the big show will be a military parade at the coastal city of Haifa. An Israeli military source said Sunday Israel will unveil for the first time 12 swift, modern Mystere jet fighters bought from France. They will fly over Haifa.

The informant indicated the French jets, somewhat equalized the MIG-15 jets the Soviets have sold to Egypt. Hammarskjöld, at his head-

quarters in Beirut, Lebanon, worked with his staff until 4 a.m. after a surprise automobile tour of the tense Gaza strip border and southern Israel. He crossed the bustling demarcation line enroute from Cairo to Beirut.

Tension Relieved

In the week he has been in the Middle East, Hammarskjöld has succeeded in relieving the tension somewhat and shootings across the Israeli-Egyptian border have almost stopped.

Both sides have agreed unconditionally to refrain from violence except in self-defense, but Hammarskjöld's aide has declined to say whether both sides have actually given orders to their troops to make the agreement effective.

U.S. Advised to Stop Giving Money to Asia

ASLOMAR, Calif. (U) — The United States was advised Sunday to stop "giving away" money in the Far East and to cease talking about American military strength.

The advice came from Eric A. Johnston, special representative of the President, who has just re-

turned from a world trip during which he spent two months in Asian countries.

"It is a mistake to give money away," Johnston told the some 600 persons attending the final session of the Northern California World Affairs Council's 10th annual conference here.

Survey Sees Good Crop Prospects

PORTLAND (U) — Excellent moisture conditions and plentiful irrigation water supplies were reported in a general crop survey issued by the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the Oregon State College extension service.

Satisfactory temperatures in recent weeks stimulated crop growth, which had been retarded by the winter's cold, the report said. Most observers reported pasture two to three weeks behind normal development as of April 1. This, together with the loss of pasture early last fall, has resulted in an unusually long feeding period, and depletion of roughage and feed grain supplies.

Concerning American talk about military strength, Johnston said that every time he picked up a newspaper in the Far East he found an article quoting some U.S. official about how strong we are.

Johnston said that because of all this talk about military strength, the people in Asia do not think the United States wants peace.

New Manager For Portland's Symphony Named

PORTLAND (U) — The Portland Symphony Society has appointed John E. Kornfield, 33, a native of Newburgh, Mass., as manager of the city's symphony orchestra.

Kornfield will take over his new duties May 15 to succeed Phil H. Hart, who resigned to become assistant manager of the Chicago symphony orchestra.

The new manager has had extensive experience in the field. For two years he was a representative for Community Concerts, a subsidiary of Columbia Artists Management, doing promotional work and booking artists.

"This American approach does not fit the objectives of the people of the Far East," Johnston said.

Johnston, who as special representative of the President has the rank of ambassador at the Jordan River development plan and, in addition, is president of the Motion Picture Assn. of America, listed the three paramount objectives of Asians:

Art Workshop For Teachers

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North Africa Rebels Defy French Plea

ALGERIA, Algeria (U) — The powerful national liberation front declared Sunday there can be no cease-fire in Algeria until France recognizes Algeria's independence.

France has insisted there can be no talk of greater self rule until rebels lay down their arms. France is pouring more troops into this North African land to stamp out rebellion.

The "general staff" of the liberation front also thanked Arab states "who have concretely manifested their solidarity with martyred Algeria."

The defiant statement was published in L'Action, a French language weekly in Tunis. It is generally considered the mouthpiece of Habib Bourguiba, named premier only last week of newly independent Tunisia.

Meantime, the battle between French and Algerian rebels raged on as it has for 16 months.

French sources said 22 rebels were killed Sunday in a single fight with French ground and air forces.

4 Destroyers En Route to Middle East

NEWPORT, R.I. (U) — Four Newport-based destroyers sailed Sunday for the troubled Mediterranean area.

Some 100 dependents of the 1,000 crewmen were on hand to wave good-bye as the destroyers McNair, McGowan, Lewis Hancock and the Sullivan sailed down Newport bay.

The destroyers, comprising division 202 of the Atlantic Fleet destroyer force, are under command of Cmdr. Hugh W. Howard of Olympia, Wash.

The destroyers sailed with full combat power and full crews, some 100 sailors having volunteered Saturday to fill 26 vacancies.

Man Charged With Larceny

A Salem man was held in Marion County Jail following his arrest Sunday on a charge of grand larceny.

Lewey Lee Overfield, 22, who gave his address as a Salem motel, is accused of taking a trailer, winch and large house moving wheel from Elmer Lampman, 209 W. Water St.

Overfield was arrested on a Station Justice Court John Doe warrant by Marion County sheriff's deputies and Station city police.

Father of Two Dies in Car Flip

NEWPORT, Wash. (U) — A 22-year old father of two children was killed Sunday morning when the car in which he was riding flipped over and down a shallow embankment and crashed into a telephone pole near here.

The dead man was identified as Charles E. Sifton of Newport.

Weapons Count Faces Youth, 16

A 16-year-old Salem boy was arrested by city police Saturday night on a charge of carrying concealed weapons.

He was detained in the juvenile section of city jail after a knife with a 4-inch blade and a 5-inch length of chain fastened to leather handles were found in the youth's possession. The arrest followed a complaint by an employee of a Salem ice cream store who reported seeing the boy displaying the knife to some fellow teenagers, police said.

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Businessman Who Mailed Bank Dies

HAYDEN, Utah (U) — The man who mailed a two-story bank to eastern Utah died here Saturday. He was 75-year-old William Horace Coltharp, pioneer Utah Basin businessman and president of the Bank of Vernal.

When Coltharp built his bank in nearby Vernal, Utah, in 1919, he discovered he could save \$1.45 on each hundred pounds of bricks by shipping them from Salt Lake City via parcel post rather than by railroad freight.

The thousands of bricks needed to build the structure all went parcel post. And, because there was no direct mail route between Salt Lake and Vernal—175 miles apart—the post office had to ship the bricks over a 407-mile route south to Price, Utah, and via Black, Colo., using the railroad, trucks and teams-and-wagons.

The U. S. Post Office Department soon changed its regulations after hurried local postal authorities complained. But by that time the bank was completed. It still operates today.

Coltharp is survived by his widow, three sons and a daughter. A requiem mass will be said in his behalf Tuesday in Vernal, where he was born.

Teeners Mob Rock 'N Roll Guitar Player

SAN ANTONIO, Tex. (U) — A "rock and roll" singer who's the sensation of the younger set took refuge in his dressing room Sunday when some 3,000 teen-agers rushed him for his autograph.

Elvis Presley, 21, of Memphis, Tenn., plays a guitar and dances as part of his routine.

At the end of the show, Presley's manager set up a table outside the Municipal Auditorium and asked the youngsters wishing autographs to line up.

About half the crowd of some 6,000—mostly teen-agers—stormed the table. The singer fled to his dressing room where he managed to give out several autographs through a barred window.
