Museum for Casey Jones Dedicated

JACKSON Tenn. (AP) — The Casey Jones Museum was dedicated Monday to the 50th anniversary of the train wreck at Vaughn, Miss., that made old Case a famous railroad hero.

Mrs. Casey Jones, 80, cut the ceremonial ribbon stretched across the porch of her former home, now the main section of the museum.

Frank Clement presided over the ceremony, which was held at the home of a prominent American institution and a local newspaper.

Such a man was Casey Jones. The museum contains Casey's wildcat whistle, telegraph keys, lantern, pass books and numerous other obsolete railroad items of the Jones era.

Casey was making the run from Memphis to Canton, Miss., as engineer on the Illinois Central's "Cannonball" when the wreck occurred.

Sam Webb, an 82-year-old Memphis Negro who was firing at Casey that day, told the crowd about the incident.

I believed something was coming on the main track," said Webb. "Then Mr. Jones yelled for me to jump and jump I did."

Railroad records show that another train had been backed onto the main line by mistake. Casey died in the wreck.

NEW YORK (AP) — Softness in the motors and most other sections of the list Tuesday added up to a moderate decline in the stock market.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks lost 80 cents at \$190.30. The industrial component of the average was down \$1.90, railroads dropped back 40 cents, while utilities gained 10 cents.

There were 1,205 individual issues traded, of which 381 advanced and 394 declined with 73 new highs and 60 new lows for the year.

Volume came to 2,500,000 shares as compared with 2,730,000 shares Monday.

Goose-Step Troops March In East Zone

BERLIN (AP) — The new "National Peoples Army" of Communist East Germany marched in parade Tuesday for the first time.

Nearly 6,000 armed, goose-stepping infantrymen, garbed in a uniform similar to that of Hitler's Wehrmacht, passed in review in a giant Communist May Day parade in East Berlin.

About 500,000 persons participated in the demonstration. Behind the army units came waves after waves of uniformed "fighting groups" of factory workers, Communist youth organizations and units of the "Peoples Police."

Allied authorities have contended that all of Berlin is still occupied territory and therefore still governed by four-power occupation regulations which forbid military formations.

U. S. State Department officials in Berlin said they had "no comment" on today's display.

East German Communists, with Russian backing, say East Berlin is no longer occupied. They have pronounced it the sovereign capital of a sovereign East Germany.

The People's Army, authorized last January, paraded with rifles, machineguns and rocket throwers. Some of the soldiers rode in motor-cycles, trucks and armored cars.

PORTLAND (AP) — The Shea Company of Alhambra, Calif., submitted the low bid of \$97,280 Tuesday for the first construction work on the 33 million-dollar Hills Creek Dam on the middle fork of the Willamette River.

The first work calls for construction of the Kilton Springs detour road and a diversion tunnel at the dam site.

There were five other bidders. The government estimate for the work was \$1,032,000.

The recent Congress appropriated \$100,000 for continued planning and start of construction at the dam, which is closely related to the Lookout Point project.

It will take four years to complete the Hills Creek Dam, which will have a generating capacity of 30,000 kilowatts.
