AURORA — Final rites for Emma J. Snyder, 80, daughter of an original Aurora colonist, will be held at 2 p.m. Friday at the Aurora Chapel of Everhart and Kent Mortuary. The deceased was born Aug. 9, 1875, at Aurora, a daughter of Charles and Christina Schuele Snyder. Her father came to Aurora with the colonists from Bethel, Mo., in 1855 and her mother came in 1867. Miss Snyder had been assistant postmaster at Aurora and was a charter member of Una Temple, Pythian Sisters. She was a past grand chief and past grand secretary of the Pythian Sisters of Oregon. Surviving are a brother, Ernest J. Snyder, and six nieces and nephews including Miss Leona Will, Carl Snyder and Percy Will, all of Aurora. Dr. Earl Benbow, pastor of Aurora Presbyterian Church will officiate at the service. Vault interment will follow in Aurora Cemetery.
