

# Both Parties Ready for Far Policy Battle

**WASHINGTON** — The two major parties have pretty well outlined their campaign strategy for the farm vote in this fall's presidential and congressional campaigns.

The Republican campaign will be pitched on the theme that the farm boom in farm prices will be passed and agriculture is on the road to greater stability and prosperity.

Democrats, on the other hand, will attempt to drive home the argument that farmers seldom have prospered under Republicans and haven't any reason to think they can in the future.

The men who will direct their respective party's farm vote campaign have newsmen a preview of their plans at a meeting here this week.

H. S. Nelson, farm director for the Republican national headquarters, expressed belief that the farm issue in key states will be the level of farm prices and not the year's controversy between the GOP administration and the Democratic-controlled Congress over price support levels.

Nelson said farmers are not interested in price support controversies or in other vehicles and mechanisms used by the government in agriculture's behalf. What they are interested in, he said, are farm prices themselves.

Pointing to an upturn in farm prices this year, Nelson said, "We've turned the corner." He said that as a result of this improvement, there was much less dissatisfaction with the GOP administration than was the case last year.

Truman victory. But Wesley McCune, farm director for the Democrats, will pattern his drive for farm votes on the campaign the Democrats waged in 1948. That was the year President Truman won an upset victory over Republican Thomas E. Dewey on the basis of farm votes.

Both McCune and Nelson will concentrate their efforts on such Midwestern corn belt and dairy states as Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Michigan, Minnesota, Wisconsin, Iowa and Nebraska with some, though less effort on North Dakota, South Dakota, Kansas and Missouri.

McCune said the Democrats will attack farm policies of the Eisenhower administration largely on the arguments that it has broken 1953 campaign promises on price supports, has allowed farm prices and incomes to decline, has allowed "fear of the future" to seize farmers, has followed credit policies not helpful to farmers, has pushed farmers out of operation of farm programs, has curtailed crop insurance programs, has "preached" to farmers, has attempted to pit consumers against farmers and has not followed proper policies designed to help farmers obtain adequate supplies of power at reasonable prices.

"Peace" issue. In his campaign for farm votes for Eisenhower and Republican candidates for Congress, Nelson expects help from what he called the "peace issue." He said the fact that the country is not at war will have great influence among farm voters, especially women.

The GOP farm director will count heavily on prices of hogs—a major source of farm income in the key Midwestern states. "One of the most significant political developments of recent months," he said, "has been the recovery in hog prices. We expect further improvements before election time."

McCune said that the administration made what he said was "probably a very slick move" in announcing a price support program for corn which heretofore had not been eligible for such aid.

Under this program, corn produced by farmers who exceed their government planting allotments will be eligible for price supports at \$1.25 a bushel. Those who comply with allotments will get \$1.30. Previously there had been no supports for noncompliers.

But the Democrats will attack this program, McCune said, on the grounds that it could bring about a breakdown in the corn control program.

On the GOP side in this contest for votes, Nelson said, is the "inclination" for a sizable majority of farmers in the critical Midwestern states to vote Republican.

But McCune argued that at times when agriculture's economic welfare is an issue, farmers recognize that the Democratic party is more greatly dedicated to the cause of farming than the Republican party.
