# Hearings, Elections Dated on Two Silverton School Budgets

**SILVERTON**—Voting on Silverton school budgets, both in district 73 and district 4C, will not be done at the regular school elections which come June 18 and June 25, but at a 4 1/2 day election, a special one, on for May 28. The budget for the Union High School 73 will be arranged or rejected at the various schools comprising the Union High School district and for 4C at Eugene Field School in Silverton.

## Both Hearings May 28

Stated for simultaneous hearings are the budgets of the two school districts, with 73 to be held at the high school and 4C at the grade school. While members of 4C are also members of 73 both hearings will be held May 28, at 1 p.m.

The 4 per cent limitation has not been set for the Union High School district as yet, although this is the second year the budget has been voted. Board members said Tuesday they hoped it would be established by next voting date.

Total estimated expenditures for the Union High were set at \$228,377, with estimated receipts and available cash balances at \$113,710, leaving \$114,667 necessary to balance the budget. Estimated amount of taxes that will not be collected during the fiscal year is \$10,000 making a total of \$238,377 to be raised by tax levies all outside the 4 per cent limitation.

**\$9,000 Salary**

Largest item in instruction, which totals \$128,206 without the salary of the superintendent and clerical accounts. The superintendent's salary for the ensuing year is \$9,000, a raise of \$750 above the current year. Total increase in salaries excluding that of the superintendent is \$7,251.

Total bonded indebtedness of this district is \$551,000.

Total estimated expenditures for district 4C, the grade school, has been set at \$95,443. Available cash

and estimated receipts total \$47,241, leaving \$48,202 to be raised by tax levies of which \$24,000 is outside the 4 per cent limitation. This district carries an indebtedness.

**Capital Outlay**

Suggest outlay in the 4C schedule will be the capital outlay which provides for the new Junior High School building at \$250,000, totaling \$250,000. Instruction will cost the district \$143,000, approximately \$10,000 above a year ago, and \$20,000 above two years ago.

General control is down about \$1,000 due to a \$2,000 allowed for a clerk for this current year, which has been eliminated for the coming year. Half of the superintendent's salary is paid in cash in 4C district and the raise in this as well as minor other additions, takes in the \$1,000 slack in the \$2,000 elimination.

Also down about \$1,000 this year from the past two years is maintenance and repairs.

Retiring student body officers and commissioners and retiring Lamson and Grove editors will be presented with cups in recognition of their service to the school. They in turn will officially install their replacements for next year. Those who served as chairman of major campus events will also be recognized.

Football, basketball, baseball, track, tennis and WRA awards will be presented by the respective coaches and advisors. An outstanding athlete award will also be made.

Special citations which are scheduled to be given are the Elvise Buck Memorial Award for outstanding accomplishment in creative writing, the Delmer Dewey Memorial Award to the outstanding senior man, the Julia McCulloch Smith Award to the outstanding senior woman, and the Jacquelyn Stuart Graham Memorial Award for outstanding accomplishment in music. Kings and queens who have reigned over OCE festivities will also be recognized.

Another highlight of the evening will be the naming of the faculty member who has made the greatest contribution to OCE student life during the year.
