World Hop **Crop Totals** In Decrease

WASHINGTON IF -The 1955-56 world hop crop totaled 134 million BRITON CONSIDERS pounds, the United States Department of Argiculture Foreign Agricultural Service reports.

This represents a 7 per cent from the 143,600,000 pounds harvested in 1954-55, but is about 17 per cent larger than the average for the five-year period immediately following World War II. This year's production, however, is only about 2 per cent the Nepal side. above the average from the immediate pre-war years.

The reduced crop was due main v crops in the United State ermany and Czechoslovakie, the hree most import hop exporting ountries. Nations showing increases in production were the nited Kingdom, Belgium, Japan, France and Spain.

The agency's report said that Despite the smaller world crop and improved purchasing power in most hops importing countries, 1.S. exports of hops during 1955-(September-August; are not likely to show an appreciable in-crease of the 11 to 12 million pound level of recent years."




