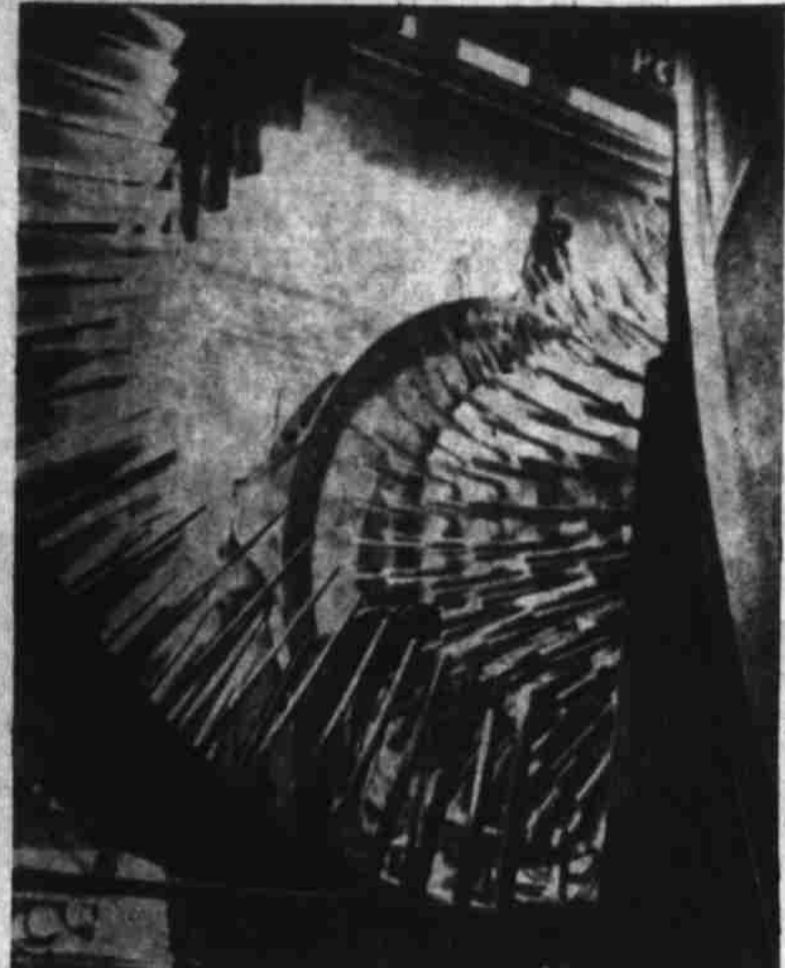


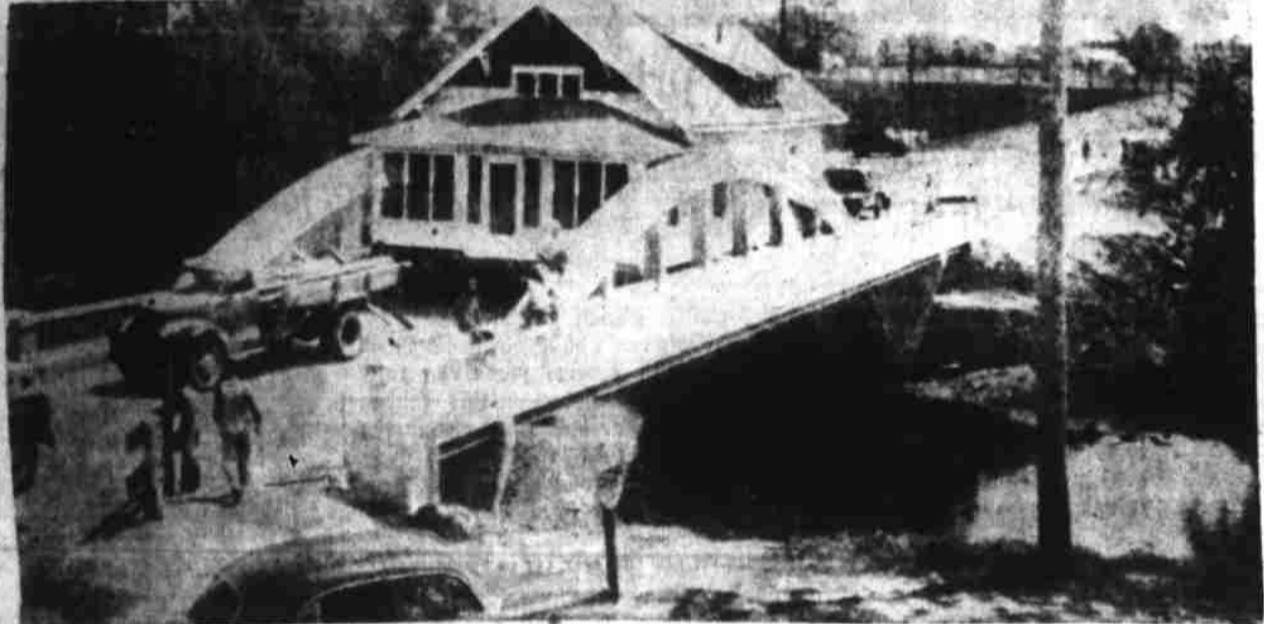
Speedy Wind Tunnel Unveiled



Lot of Wind CLEVELAND—Nation's largest supersonic wind tunnel was unveiled Tuesday by National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics. 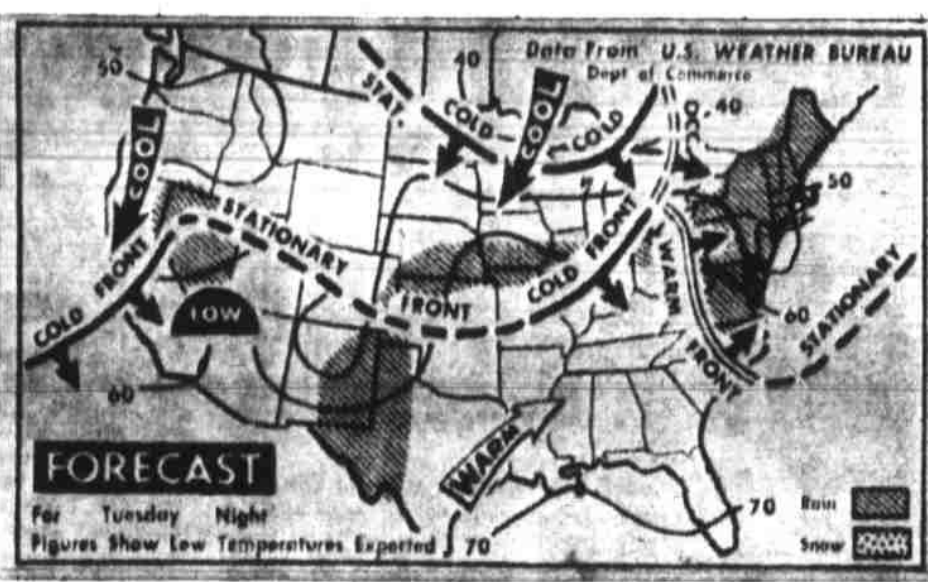
