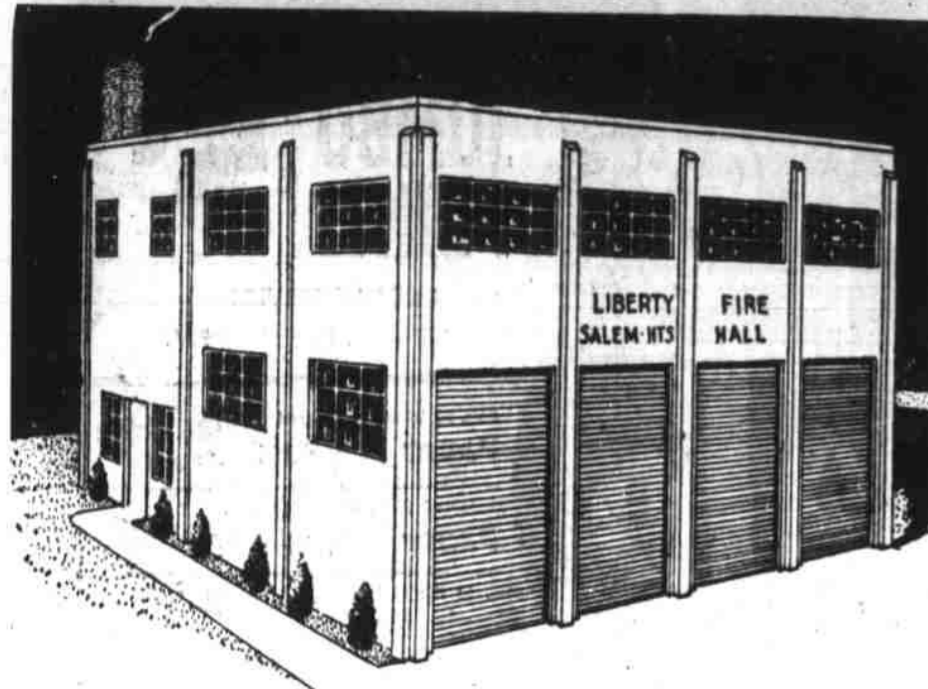


Election Due on Proposed New Fire Hall

Stroke Fatal To W. Searth Of Silverton

SILVERTON—William Searth, 92, of William Searth & Sons, grain and seed mill at Silverton, died Sunday morning at the Silverton Memorial Hospital. He was hospitalized a week ago, suffering from pneumonia, from which he had recovered when he was taken by a stroke Sunday.

Mr. Searth was born September 4, 1863, in Binscarth, Orkney Islands, British Isles, and came to Canada in 1890, living in Binscarth, Manitoba, where on June 18, 1895 he was married. His widow, Ella P. Searth, survives at Silverton.

The family moved to Toledo, Ore., in 1902 and after a few years there went to Portland, where Searth was associated with Balfour Guthrie grain dealers for 20 years. They came to Silverton in 1930 and bought the old Loughmiller mill on Front and N. Water, later building a new plant farther north on North Water Street.

In addition to the widow, survivors are two sons, W. P. Searth who is now manager of the Searth mill at Silverton, and James A. Searth at Walpole; six grandchildren and five great-grandchildren; a sister, Mrs. Walter Bell, Beccles, England, and a brother, Matt Searth, Binscarth, Manitoba, Canada.

Funeral arrangements are in charge of Ekman's at Silverton, and burial will be in the family plot at Toledo.
