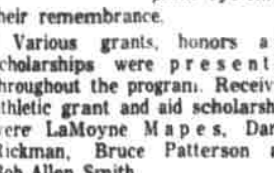


Microphone System Given to School by South High Seniors

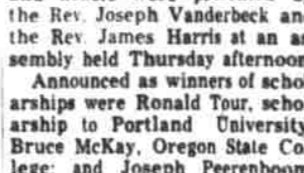


Barbara Boniface, Statesman School Reporter, presented the microphone system to the South High seniors.

Diplomas went to 59 Sacred Heart Academy seniors at commencement exercises Thursday night at Parrish Junior High School auditorium.

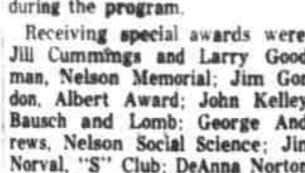


Will Bateson, Statesman School Reporter, presented the diplomas to the Sacred Heart Academy seniors.

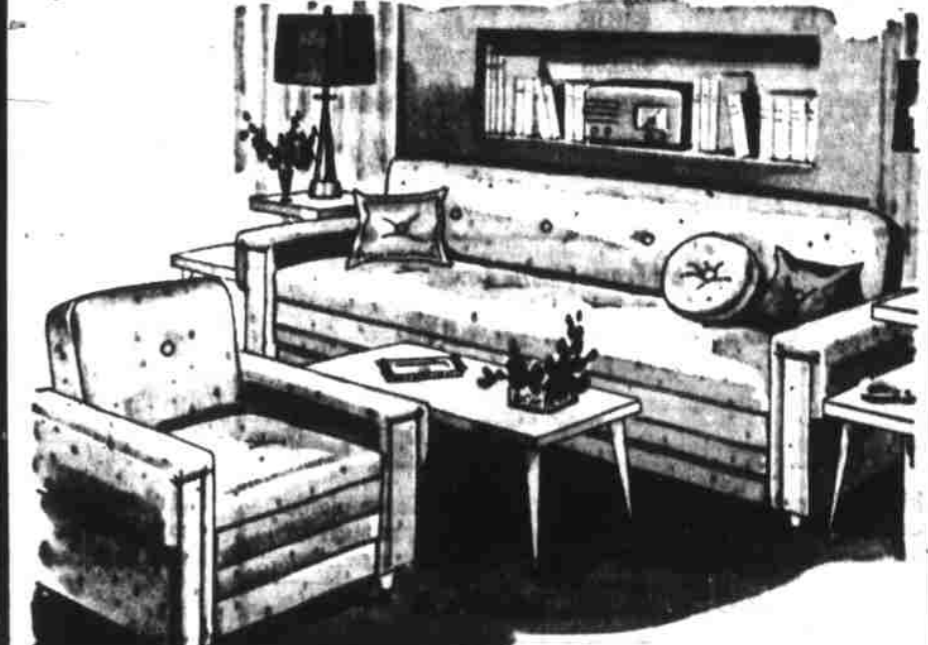
