

Ike Calls Meet to Promote Global Friendship Among Peoples

WASHINGTON, June 1 (AP)—President Eisenhower Thursday called a White House conference for June 12 to explore ways of developing "better people-to-people contacts and partnerships throughout the world" in the interest of world peace.

American leaders in many non-government fields have been invited to take part.

The White House said the goal is to promote contacts with peoples in iron curtain countries as well as in the free nations.

Press Secretary James C. Hagerty said one logical result could be implementation of the President's proposal at Baylor University last week that America's great universities and large private foundations help establish science and cultural education centers in needy free nations.

People-to-People

In that address at Waco, Texas, Eisenhower declared:

"Such a voluntary effort in people-to-people partnership would be a dynamic, a fruitful corollary to the elements already effectively at work in our governmental foreign policy."

The President already has invited 34 American leaders from such fields as business, education, agriculture, advertising, the motion picture industry and church groups to the conference.

In his letter of invitation, the President said the government at present "has a relatively modest apparatus for trying to make the United States' objectives and principles better understood throughout the world."

Extra Funds Sought

Alluding to the program of the U. S. Information Agency in that field, Eisenhower noted he has asked Congress for additional funds "to strengthen this activity."

Then he added:

"But, clearly, there will never be enough diplomats and information officers at work in the world to get the job done without help from the rest of us. Indeed, if our American ideology is eventually to win out in the great struggle being waged between the two opposing ways of life, it must have the active support of thousands of private independent groups and institutions and of millions of individual Americans acting through person-to-person communication in foreign lands."

Eisenhower said Secretary of State Dulles and Theodore C. Streibert, chief of the Government's Information Agency, join him in the conviction that "there is something important which every U. S. citizen—man, woman and child—can do to help make the truth of our peaceful goals and our respect for the rights of others known to more people overseas."

The President says he intends to call on U. S. citizens for help in this field, but decided to bring together first "a group of distinguished American leaders to assist with the organization of various phases of the work."

After saying the President's goal is to develop more and better people-to-people contacts, Hagerty added in reply to a question that he does not know whether the program will result in bringing more Russians to the United States and in a possible lowering of Iron Curtain travel barriers.
