Seefried, Conner, Amara, Sopranos on Radio Programs

Soprano Irngard Seefried and pianist Tatjana Nikolaiewa will be soloists in the second of four broadcasts from the Mozart Bicentennial Festival in Salzburg on World Music Festivals. Ernest Maczendorfer will conduct the Mozart Orchestra and Carl Schuricht will conduct the Vienna Philharmonic, in an all-Mozart program.

Lucine Amara, young soprano of the Metropolitan Opera will be soloist on the Telephone Hour Monday night, and Nadine Conner, also of the Met sings on The Voice of Frisstone.

Those interested enough to listen through an hour of assorted offerings, may enjoy the moments devoted to the singing of Robert Merrill on the Woolworth Hour beginning at noon. Libricee is also scheduled to perform. The following program is on today's list:
