## Drive-Your-Self Truck Firm Files Suit Over State Order

Oregon's biggest drive-your-self truck firm filed a suit against the state Public Utilities Commissioner here Wednesday, seeking a declaratory judgment to prevent the PUC from regulating its operation.

Plaintiff in the suit was the Hertz Corporation, a Delaware corporation with its principal Oregon offices in Portland.

Target of the Hertz firm was Oregon's Motor Transportation Code which it claims is unconstitutional in its regulation over drive-your-self vehicles which is its specialty. The code is administered by the PUC.

The complaint filed in Marion County Circuit Court says the code interferes with the truck rental business and damages the reputation of the firm unlawfully. It also claimed the code was discriminatory and attempts to subject private business to public regulation.

PUC Commissioner Charles Heltzel said Wednesday afternoon that his legal department had not yet received a copy of the Hertz complaint but that it had been anticipated after the firm's protest over regulations and permits required for truck operations in Oregon.

An answer to the complaint will be prepared by the PUC, Heltzel said. Another suit pending in the courts in part contests the regulation of truck rental firms. Heltzel added. This suit involves Thornton McDonald and the Public Utilities Commission, he said.

## Fall Injuries Bring Suit

A worker who says he suffered permanent injuries in a fall from an icy roof is suing his employers for \$18,543.70 in Marion County Circuit Court here.

Bringing the suit is Manuel Costello who said he was employed by Theodore, Leonard, Albert and Arnold Schindler in repairing the roof when the accident occurred. He blamed the fall for negligence in failure to provide safeguards which would have prevented his fall.

Costello said he suffered painful and permanent injuries to his legs and back in the tumble which he said occurred Jan. 10, 1953.
