

National Guard Camp Bids 318 With Three Salem Companies

Salem's three National Guard units will send a total of 318 officers and men to an annual summer camp starting this week-end.

Companies B and D of the 162nd Infantry Regiment of the 41st Division will entrain at 8 a.m. Saturday for the division training site at Fort Lewis. The special troop train also will carry 41st Division elements from Dallas, Silverton and Woodburn, and other points to the south.

Salem Battery D of the 722nd Anti-Aircraft Battalion, comprising some 95 officers and men, leaves by truck convoy early Saturday for its training grounds at Camp Clatsop near Astoria.

Company B has a membership of 138 officers and men, making it largest single unit in the entire 41st Division. Company D's roster shows 85 officers and men.


