

Demo Delegation to Form Here on July 7

Oregon's delegation to the Democratic National Convention in Chicago will organize at a Salem meeting July 7 in the Marion County Courthouse.

Most of the party's 16 delegates and many of their alternates are expected here for the meeting at which a chairman and vice chairman will be chosen.

Sessions will open at a luncheon meeting in the Senator Hotel at which Jason Lee, Salem attorney, will be master of ceremonies. Taking over as temporary chairman at the business session to follow will be Roy R. Hewitt, also of Salem. Lee was elected delegate from the state at large while Hewitt won a position as 1st Congressional District delegate.

Speculation by party members here indicates that Sen. Richard L. Neuberger, Portland, will receive 11,447 votes for delegate-at-large to lead all other candidates. Second ranking Mrs. Edith Green, congresswoman from Oregon's third district, was expected to get the vice chairman role.

The Tuesday affair will be at 6:30 p. m. in the Marion Hotel. Grand Commander Smith, former educator, attorney and banker, is a native of Georgia and was long-time resident of Mississippi. He became a master Mason in 1907 and a Scottish Rite 32nd degree Mason and Shriner in 1920. He has been active in the Scottish Rite Supreme Council since 1933 and has served grand commander since last October.

GOP Hoping Pig Crop Cut To Add Votes

WASHINGTON (AP) - The government Thursday forecast a smaller pig crop - and Republican strategists hope this means more votes for the GOP.

An Agriculture Department report showed that farmers are voluntarily curtailing production of hogs 8 per cent this year in an effort to bolster prices. A survey indicated production will total 88 million head compared with 95 million last year. Prices tumbled 40 per cent last year as a result of the big crop and brought appeals from Secretary Benson that production be reduced this year.

Farmers complained bitterly over the price decline and the government engaged in a surplus pork buying campaign in an effort to raise hog prices. As a result of the indicated cut in production, prices are expected to be considerably higher at election time this year than a year earlier, when markets were depressed. Republican leaders have been pinning hopes of carrying states on the possibility of higher hog prices.

The downturn in production will reduce supplies of pork at meat counters during the 12-month period beginning with the late summer this year. But supplies of beef and poultry are expected to continue at last year's high levels. The report put the 1956 spring pig crop at 53,065,000 head compared with 57,600,000 for the 1955 spring crop and 53,923,000 for the 1954 spring crop. This 8 per cent reduction from last year's spring crop was four times as great as the department had forecast last December.

Bill Seeks Italy Ownership of Continental Shelf

ROME (AP) - A bill in the chamber of deputies seeks to establish Italian ownership of the continental shelf in the Mediterranean on a contour line drawn at 200 meters depth.

The line would be adjusted where there is a conflict with a neighboring country over an adjacent area. Israel is believed to be the only Mediterranean country thus far having staked a claim to mineral rights on the continental shelf.
