Regular business meeting of Bethel 43, Job's Daughters will be held Monday night at the Scottish Rite Temple at 7:30 p.m.

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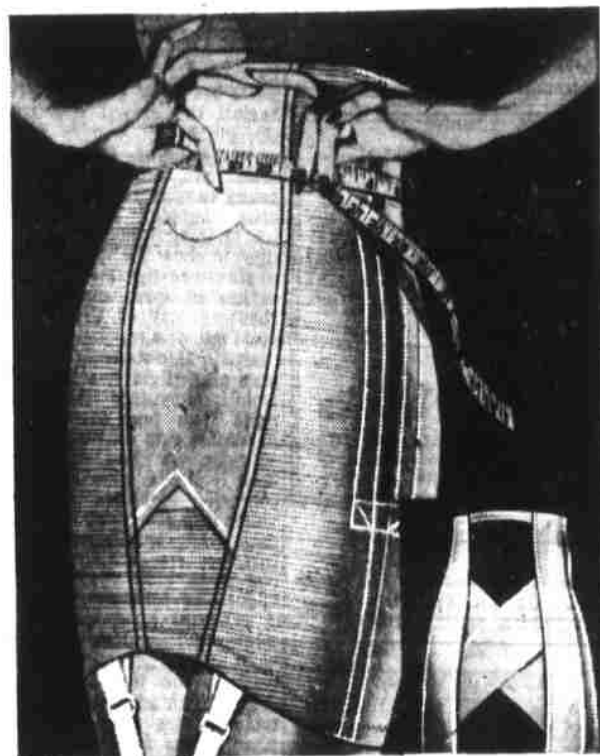
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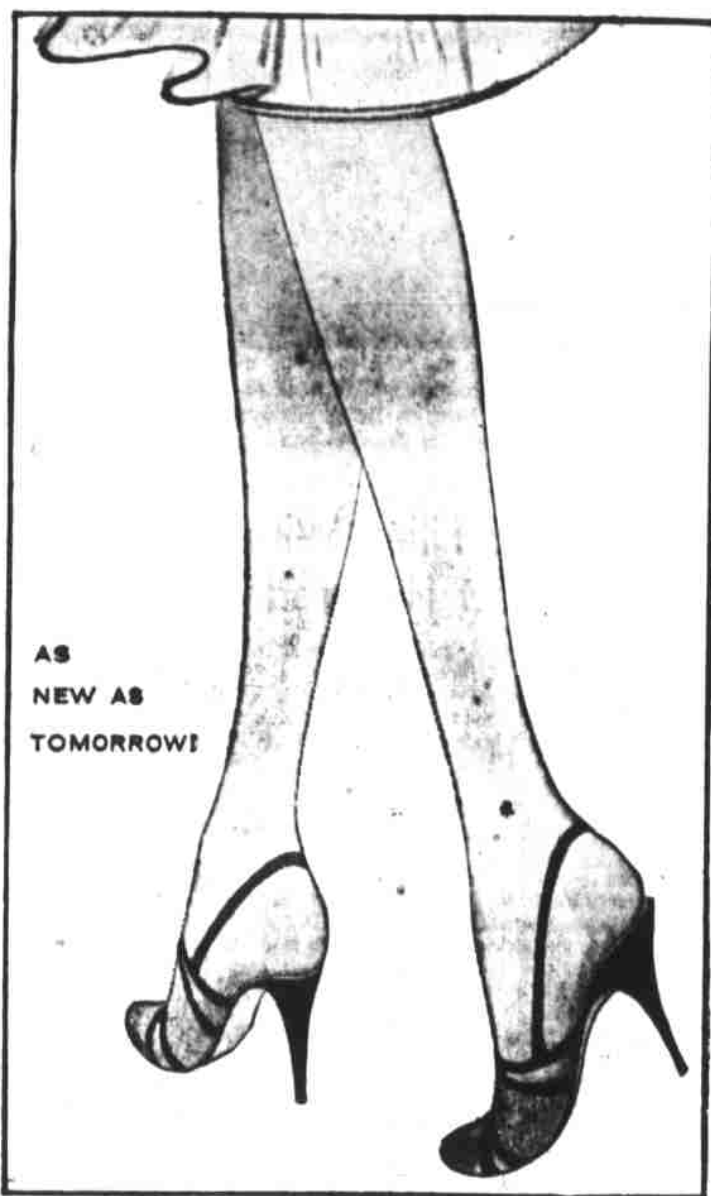
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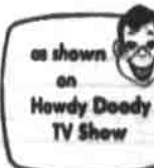


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
