Twining Warns Russ As Reds Gulp Toasts To Ike's Leadership

MOSCOW (AP)—Gen. Nathan S. Twining told Soviet leaders Sunday night the United States is a peaceful nation but will not disarm again "until we are sure of worldwide arms control."

The U.S. Air Force chief, here by Soviet invitation to see Sunday's air exhibit that showed seven new Soviet fighter planes and a jet-propeller transport, spoke at a defense ministry party. Lavish toasts were drunk to President Eisenhower by the Soviet hierarchy.

Solons Face 'Hot' Week In Congress

WASHINGTON (AP)—Issues likely to figure large in the coming election year campaigns provide Congress with a politically hot week ahead.

The week's schedule, certain to touch off fireworks on both sides of the Capitol, includes action on proposals for billions more in veterans pensions, federal aid for school construction, foreign aid and defense appropriations. Civil rights legislation is another issue. Congressional agreement is due to be reached on a vast new super-highway program calling for 41,000 miles of interstate highways and \$14,000,000,000 of new motor-ing and trucking taxes.

Both Senate and House are expected to give a final okay to a compromise road bill by Wednesday and send it to the President's desk before the weekend.

With Congress rounding the turn on the final dash for adjournment next month, the customary session-end log jam has been heightened by election year efforts to write partisan legislative records for campaign use.

For the House, the week promises to be the busiest—and the hottest politically—of an otherwise laggard session.

Heading for a floor battle Tuesday, with the outcome uncertain, is a bill to boost veterans payments an estimated 1 1/2 billion dollars the first year and a total of 14 billion over the next 44 years.

Voice Good For Fine But Not for Fare

MINEOLA, N.Y. (AP)—It was the singer, not the song, that irked conductor Nestor Fagnant when a Long Island railroad commuter belted "Sweet Eloise" into the ear of a pretty red head.

The singer, Harold Frederick, 26, of Freeport, N.Y., was fined \$25 for disorderly conduct after Fagnant told district court: "The girl complained about his singing, so I suggested that she change cars, which she did. I asked him for his fare... but he couldn't come up with it. "All he did was keep on singing 'Sweet Eloise.' His voice wasn't good enough to constitute a railroad fare."

Eighth Victim Of Minneapolis Jet Crash Dies

MINNEAPOLIS (AP)—A six-year-old girl died Sunday to become the eighth victim of a jet plane crash here June 9.

Lynn D. Greening was burned over 90 per cent of her body when the plane plowed into a group of houses near Wold Chamberlain Airport.

Three playmates remained in critical condition. They are Jeffrey Kieffer, 7, and Jennie Kieffer, 2, brother and sister of Cassandra, 5, who died June 18; and Stephen Clark, 5.

Auto Safety Belt Blamed In Death

PRINCETON, N.J. (AP)—A safety belt was the instrument of death for a New York man who died Sunday from car crash injuries.

Kurt Eichler, 62, of Flushing, N.Y., was riding last Thursday in a 1956 Mercedes-Benz driven by his son, Frank, 26.

The elder Eichler's seat belt was either loose or worked loose as the car crashed into an oncoming auto, police said. The elder Eichler slipped down and the safety belt caught him on the throat, severing his trachea.

C. of C. Says 'Politics' in Dam Battle

WASHINGTON (AP)—The council of state chambers of commerce said Sunday politics provides the drive in Congress for the proposed federal Hells Canyon dam.

The council said in a statement that the proposed federal project in the Snake River between Idaho and Oregon would cost a half-billion dollars.

This would be a "totally unnecessary burden on the American taxpayers," the council said, because the Idaho Power Co. is building three dams in the same river reach at its own expense and they would "help finance government to the tune of almost 10 million dollars a year in taxes."

Idaho Power is proceeding under a Federal Power Commission license, the validity of which has been challenged in the U. S. court of appeals by public power groups advocating the federal project.

Death Claims Vice Admiral

SAN DIEGO, Calif. (AP)—Vice Adm. Francis X. McInerney, 57, USN Retired, died in Naval Hospital Sunday from a cerebral hemorrhage. His wife died a month ago.

He was holder of the navy cross, the service's highest award, for gallantry as a destroyer force commander in directing rescue of 163 survivors of the sunken cruiser Helena from a Japanese-held island in the Solomons during World War II.

He commanded the battleship Washington later in the war and in 1952-53 was commander of an amphibious group in Korea waters. He retired in 1955.

A native of Cheyenne, Wyo., McInerney was graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1920.
