COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) — Two Hoosier sharpshooters, senior Rudy Boyd of Northwestern and junior Bill Redding of Purdue, Monday paced the first half of the qualifier for the 59th National Intercollegiate Golf Championship at Ohio State University's 7,120-yard, par 72 course.

Berg's had to go one extra inning to gain the league leadership. The clubs were tied 3-3 at the end of 7 innings. In J's Drive of the eighth Ed Swearingner knocked in Mike Mills with what might have been the winning run but in the bottom half of the inning Bill Lang uncoiled a long single that drove in both the tying and winning runs.

Lang hit 3-for-4 during the game and Elvin Paynter, Berg's winning pitcher, hit 2-for-3 to help his cause.

Gene Gilbertson limited Four Corners to one hit in the top-5ed 28-2 game won by Truax. Truax was helped by 22 walks issued by two Four Corners pitchers. Big inning was the third when Truax scored 13 times, with Gilbertson contributing a double and triple that knocked in five runs.
