

More Evidence Points to Collision Of Airliners Above Grand Canyon

GRAND CANYON, Ariz. — Investigators Thursday began studying what appeared to be more evidence that the Grand Canyon air disaster which killed all 128 persons aboard two airliners resulted from a collision in flight.

Two jagged pieces of metal, reported to have been jammed together, were recovered from shattered remnants of a United Air Lines DC7, less than a mile from wreckage of a Trans World Air Lines Super Constellation.

The two aircraft plunged into the canyon last Saturday in history's worst commercial aviation accident. Both were flying east-

ward from Los Angeles. Daring Army helicopter crews landed 150 feet from the DC7 wreck site Thursday. They were the first to get close enough to inspect the wreckage.

Oregon Pelt Profit Drops

PORTLAND — The State Game Commission reports that Oregon trappers sold \$3,332 pelts from their 1955-56 season for about \$220,000. That was \$33,000 less than the previous year.

Chet Kebbe, chief of the commission's fur-bearing section, said there were 1,598 licensed trappers.

They brought out a piece of clothing UAL engineers said was definitely from a DC7. The engineers said they could not identify the other piece, a 1-foot long chunk painted red and white. Gordon Gilmore, TWA publicist, said the piece bore markings "similar" to those on TWA's Super Constellations.

Justin D. Bowersock, aviation editor of the Kansas City Star, said in a copyrighted story that the two sections were found welded together. He interpreted the evidence as proof the planes collided.

January 'March Of Dimes' Drive Nets \$52 Million

Japanese Scientists Say U.S. Set Off 'Super Uranium Bomb'

TOKYO — Japan's meteorological research institute claimed Thursday the United States exploded a "super uranium bomb" June 13 in the Pacific testing grounds.

The institute said it based its report on an analysis of radioactive rain which fell between June 21 and June 23 in Tokyo. "There is no mistake that a super uranium bomb was tested," the institute said in a statement. "The date was June 13."

The Japanese weather bureau and other Japanese sources previously have reported that nuclear test explosions apparently took place in the Bikini area on May 28, June 26 and last Monday. The

U.S. Atomic Energy Commission has refused to confirm or deny that tests were made on those dates.

The first test explosion by the United States this year at Bikini was on May 8. On May 21 a hydrogen bomb was exploded. The AEC

said its test series would continue through June. The meteorological research institute's statement described a "super uranium bomb" as "greatly superior in explosive power."

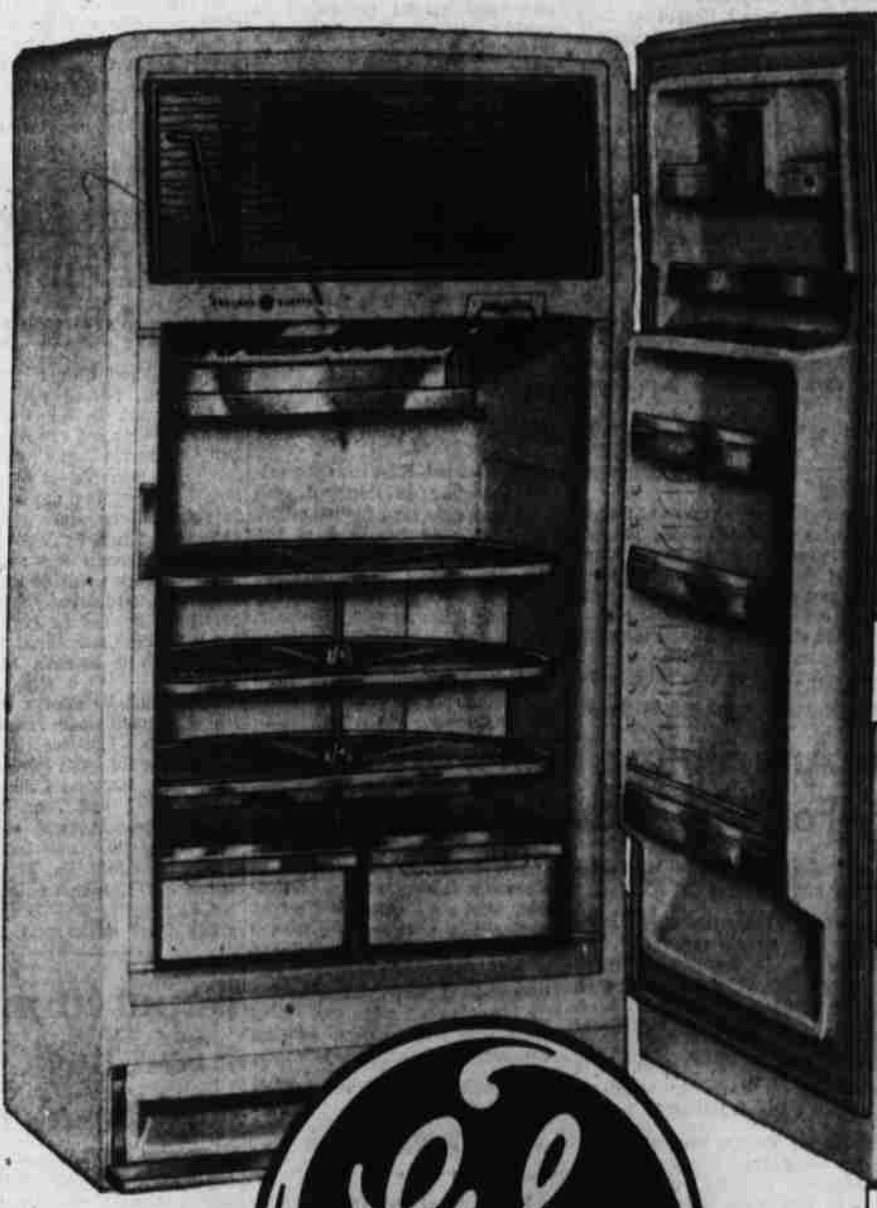
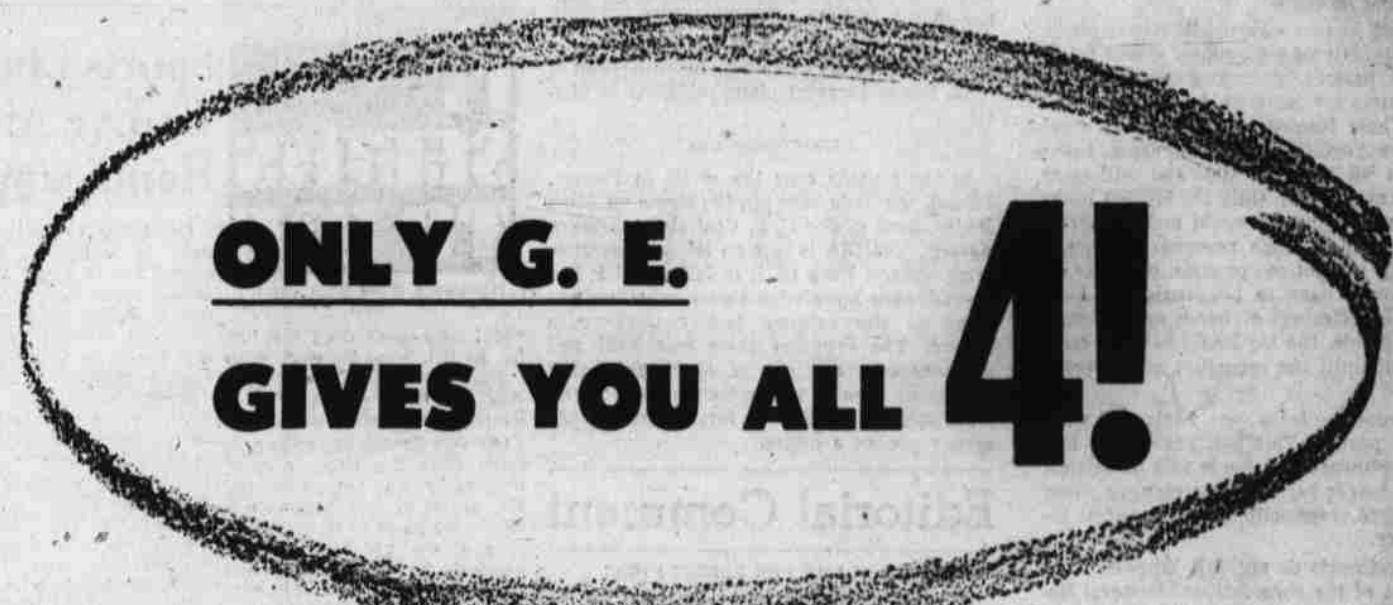
