Teague Buys Car Agency at Independence

INDEPENDENCE — Emerson Teague, former Kaiser-Frazer dealer in Salem and presently head of the Northwest Fire and Pine Lumber Co., has purchased the Richardson Chevrolet Agency here, it was made known Monday. Teague is to take possession Wednesday, July 11, and considerable refurbishing of the agency already is underway. A formal opening is planned for Friday, July 27, at 8 p.m. Present personnel is to be retained, Teague said, and three more added—Vernon Forrest and Robert Mangers, both of Salem, who will be parts-service manager and office and business manager, respectively, and Allan John, Portland, who is to be new and used car manager. All three are veterans in Chevrolet agency work. The agency is to be known as Emerson Teague Chevrolet and will continue business in the leased building owned by Merle Fulmore.

Sunken Boat's Owners Okeh

VANCOUVER, B.C. — A New Westminster man and his 13-year-old nephew returned home Monday after abandoning their sinking cruiser off Gambier Island, 25 miles northwest of here.

Hugh Giles-Holmes and his nephew, Gary Lutz, left the damaged 34-foot cruiser Crestline in a dinghy Monday and rowed to West Bay, on Gambier Island. They flew to suburban New Westminster.

Rebel Ambush Kills 7 Near City of Algiers

ALGIERS, Algeria — A French convoy was ambushed by nationalist rebels only 35 miles from the capital Monday and the unit lost seven dead and 11 wounded. The ambush was in the region of Palestro, southwest of Algiers, where French patrols have run into frequent ambushes. Headquarters reported strong reinforcements were quickly poured into the area to search for the rebel band. Headquarters also reported the city of Oran was without fresh water after rebels cut the aqueduct leading to the mountains south of the coastal city. At the same time, French authorities reported 40 known rebel dead in actions over the last 48 hours. Important arms stores were seized, the French said. The worst clash was near Bone where 12 rebels were killed.

Discovery of the sunken boat by the pilot of a passing aircraft started a widespread search of the area by surface vessels. Only the bow of the boat was showing above the water. Holmes said he and his nephew left New Westminster Friday in the cruiser for Gambier Island. A hole was punctured in the boat's hull en route, but they continued the voyage unaware of the damage. He said that by the time they abandoned the craft, water was swirling around their knees.

Canners Sign Contract With Portland Firm

PORTLAND — Cannery workers and two firms, Hudson House and Gray & Co. of Forest Grove, agreed on a new two-year contract with pay increases Monday. The agreement was announced following a 14-hour session with federal mediator Clyde Deal. Under the agreement, retroactive to May 1, the base pay of men and women will be increased six cents an hour—\$1.42 for men and \$1.22 for women. The agreement also calls for a \$10.40 a month health and welfare program beginning Aug. 1, and a 10-cent-an-hour pension plan effective May 1, 1957.

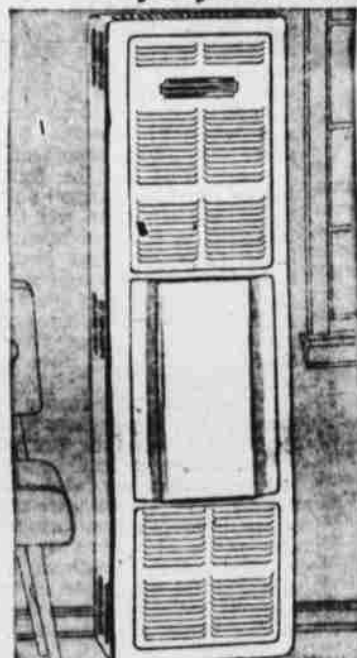
