(Cont. from preceding page) Since then, it looks like the current has turned. Long has signed pro-segregation measures sponsored by the joint legislative committee on segregation, designed to ward off integration. The committee, however, did not sponsor the sports segregation proposal.

Fred Dick Butler of the Texas League informed Gov. Long the proposal probably would eliminate Shreveport from the Class AA baseball league. The Shreveport Sports, only Louisiana member, haven't been using Negroes although most other clubs do.

The measure might force cancellation of a Louisiana State University football game with Wisconsin here in 1958. The LSU board, before the legislature met, rejected an effort to stop LSU teams from playing teams with Negro players.
