

Ecuador Girl Visits in North Santiam Area

NORTH SANTIAM—An interesting visitor to the Alfred Hofmann home in the North-Santiam Community during the current month is Miss Luz Avelino Plaza, Quito, Ecuador.

Under the International Farm Youth Exchange Program, Miss Plaza, an attractive 20-year-old brunette is on her first visit to Oregon. Miss Plaza speaks and writes English fluently, knows some French and Italian and her native language, Spanish. She has one brother and four sisters.

She attended six years of secondary schools and finishing schools at Brillantow Switzerland and Madeira School, Greenway, Virginia. Placed through the IFYE state 4-H foundation she spent 22 days at the Andrew Harvey home near Pendleton. She also attended 4-H summer school at Corvallis for 10 days during June. During this period spent with boys and girls participating in 4-H work throughout the state of Oregon. Miss Plaza declared herself much impressed by the advantages gained by the youth of this country in being able to avail themselves of learning through numerous 4-H projects.

Since Ecuador is just beginning such a program in 4-H work, Miss Plaza is especially interested in how it is being promoted here and hopes to be able to help further the movement in her own country.

Although living in the city during the school months of the year, Miss Plaza enjoys living in the country during the summer, where her father farms 6,000 acres with 1,000 acres under irrigation. With wheat, barley, corn, and potatoes being the main crops—it is primarily a dairy farm where 300 head of cattle are milked. A team of 30 Indian girls milk this vast herd besides assisting in the operation of cheese and butter plants maintained on the farm. With Miss Plaza's father as manager the farm work is conducted by a group of Indians, the Zuletenos, whom as a tribe have lived on the land for over 400 years, they are described by Miss Plaza as an intelligent, prosperous, hard working people.

Miss Plaza also speaks with pride of her father, Galo Plaza, first president in Ecuador in 35 years to finish a term of office. He served as president from 1949 to 1952 under what Miss Plaza describes as a "democratic" reign. Prior to this time, he had served 2 years as Ecuador's ambassador to the United States.

Senor Plaza is currently conducting an experiment by which he is endeavoring to show other large land owners of the country what can be done with private initiative toward raising the standard of living of the rural Indian, without involving great expense.

Miss Plaza is a member of the girl scouts and Red Cross. Her hobbies are dancing, horseback riding, travel, languages and sports. She is sponsored by the Chamber of Agriculture.

Four Corners Sets Water Issue Voting

FOUR CORNERS—A special election here Saturday, July 21, will determine whether or not a new water district will be established as a municipal corporation. Five commissioners also will be elected for the district, which is to be known as the Suburban East Salem Water District.

Hours for the election are from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday at the Four Corners Community Hall in the 3800 block of LaBranche Ave. The purpose of the water district is to supply water to the residents of this area—and to facilitate fire control.

With the continued expansion of home construction, necessitating more septic tanks and more wells, officials fear that an eventual lower water level will make contamination of water a progressively greater risk each year.

No home owner will be forced to abandon his well or to supply his home with this water. Those interested in seeing this development feel it will be a health safeguard for the future.

Valuation Increase
It will increase the valuation of property and reduce fire insurance rates. The following is a list of men who have been petitioned by the legally required number of registered voters of this proposed water district to allow their names to be presented by ballot to the voters. Of the list of names 5 will be elected to serve as commissioners for this proposed water district.

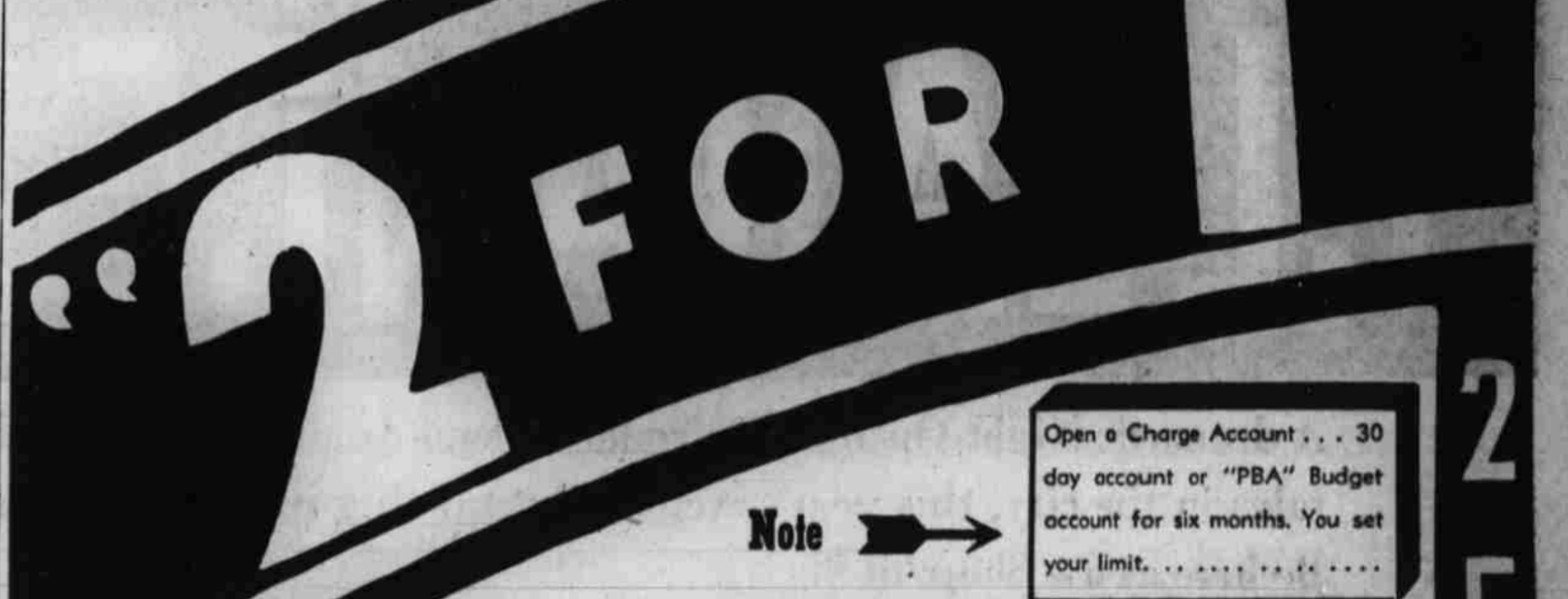
