Hebrew Christian Church Minister to Talk in Salem

Dr. A. U. Michelson, founder and minister of the First Hebrew Christian Church of Los Angeles, Calif., will speak at three Salem churches Sunday.

He will talk on "Judaism and Christianity," at the Foursquare Church at 11 a.m.; "Conflict in Palestine," First Evangelical United Brethren Church, 3 p.m.; and "Jews and the Second Coming in the Light of Prophecy," at Faith Tabernacle, 8 p.m.

Dr. Michelson has twice made extensive tours of Palestine, the new state of Israel, and Europe. He will give first-hand accounts of the development in Palestine and the unique position of the Jews today in relation to present world events.

Formerly a judge and attorney in Germany, Dr. Michelson was reared in Orthodox Jewry, but later embraced Christianity.

He is director of a world-wide missionary enterprise, with representatives in England, Australia, Germany, France, Palestine and elsewhere.

"He has the drive of a Moses and the zeal of a Paul," says the Rev. Steve Ferko of Los Angeles, field secretary of the Hebrew Evangelization Society.

"Dr. Michelson broadcasts the 'Hebrew Christian Hour.' He is slated to appear at Silverton on July 24 at 7:30 p.m. at the First Christian Church, at Newberg on July 25 and Albany on July 26.

3 Salem Men On Methodist Church Panels

Three Salem men were named to western jurisdictional boards at a recent conference of the Methodist Church at Colorado Springs, Colo.

They are Ernest W. Peterson, named to the area study commission; Dr. George Roseberry, budget and finance committee; Ervin Potter, World Peace Board.

The Rev. Lawrence Guiderian of McMinnville was named chairman of the Journals Committee.

The conference resulted in reassignment of four bishops, including A. Raymond Grant to the Portland area.

Dr. Alan Walker, leader of the Mission to the Nation in Australia, challenged the churches of America to a larger concern about 70 million Americans outside church influence. As a featured speaker he decried the world-wide disposition toward the false gods of "narrow nationalism, war and sex."

Delegates conducted studies of the progress and needs relating to the fields of evangelism, missions, education, finance and lay activities and social concern and action.

Some 130 delegates from 1,600 churches in 10 states, Alaska and Hawaii attended the convention.

Baptist Church Picks Pastor

The Rev. W. Berkeley Ormond of Casper, Wyo., will become pastor of Calvary Baptist Church in Salem, starting about Aug. 15.

His appointment was confirmed at a church business meeting. He will succeed the Rev. Omar Barth who has already left to accept a call to a church in Paterson, N.J.

The Rev. Mr. Ormond was trained at Colgate-Rochester Seminary, ordained in his native state of Virginia. He served several pastorates before going to Casper three years ago as pastor of the First Baptist Church there.
