

Stassen Gets Leave To Fight for Herter

WASHINGTON (U)—Harold Stassen is taking a month off from his White House job in an effort to avenge the GOP vice presidential nomination from Richard Nixon to Gov. Christian Herter of Massachusetts.

President Eisenhower granted his request for a leave of absence Monday, and now Stassen apparently will have both hands free to try to rearrange the bottom half of the GOP ticket.

The leave of absence, effective Thursday, was announced in a White House statement issued at Gettysburg, Pa., where Stassen conferred with Eisenhower for 20 minutes Monday morning. The statement said in part:

"Mr. Stassen wanted to have the time and the opportunity to pursue certain political activities without involving his official position or the White House."

Stassen is the President's assistant on disarmament matters. After he plumped for Herter last Monday, 20 congressmen angrily demanded that he resign from his White House post. Herter said he would nominate Nixon for reelection.

Stassen said in Washington Monday he was pleased that Eisenhower had approved a leave of absence.

"Thursday, Aug. 2," he added in a statement, "I will make a further statement about my continuing endeavor to add to the strength of the Eisenhower campaign and to the Republican congressional races through the nomination of an Eisenhower-Herter ticket."

Immediate Speculation
There was immediate speculation on whether the President's granting of leave implied a go-ahead for Stassen or whether, on the other hand, it represented a desire that Stassen divorce his highly controversial political activities from his White House assignment.

Actor Cleared In Molesting Of 2 Children

VAN NUYS, Calif. (U)—A Municipal Court jury Monday acquitted actor Buddy Baer of one count of child molestation and another charging him with being a lewd vagrant.

The jury deliberated an hour and 45 minutes. Earlier, two other charges of child molestation had been dismissed by Judge Kenneth L. Holsky on motion of Baer's attorney.

The charges against the 41-year-old actor, singer and former pugilist, brother of onetime heavyweight champion Max Baer, had been brought by two 10-year-old girls and one 12.

Throughout the trial, which began last Wednesday, Baer denied the charges and contended it was a clear case of mistaken identity.

Coffee Break Lag Broken

HARRISBURG, Pa. (U)—The Superintendent of Pennsylvania's capitol buildings decided state workers were lingering a bit too long in the capitol cafeteria during the coffee break period.

So Secretary John S. Rice, of the Department of Property and Supplies, posted a notice in the cafeteria that tables would be occupied only during a 15-minute breakfast period and a 3-hour lunch period.

Coffee breakers may still get their coffee at the counter but they must take it to their offices and sip it under the watchful eyes of their immediate superior.

Doomed Pups Get Reprieves Via 'Parade'

LIVERPOOL—(INS)—It was a matter of life or death as 47 fur-coated mannequins paraded across a flood-lit stage in a Liverpool factory canteen.

Displeasure of the 1,000 on-lookers meant the gas chamber; approval meant life and a good home.

The models were unclaimed stray puppies condemned to death in city dog-pound, but all were granted a stay of execution.

A kindly factory owner, hearing that 150 stray dogs and puppies were put to death every month in Liverpool, suggested a monthly parade in his canteen in the hope that his girl workers would fall in love with some of them.

The first parade was a complete success. All but one of the puppies were claimed by the girls.

A spokesman for the Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, claimed the last dog, a fine Alsatian puppy, for the factory manager, and explained to the disappointed girls: "He's a man's dog."

NAACP Fined \$100,000 for Hiding Lists

MONTGOMERY, Ala. (U)—The Alabama Supreme Court refused Monday to grant an immediate stay of a \$100,000 fine against the National Assn. for the Advancement of Colored People.

The fine was levied by Circuit Judge Walter B. Jones for contempt of his court by failure to produce the Alabama NAACP's records. It goes into effect at midnight.

Within an hour after Jones had rejected an NAACP request to modify the fine, attorneys asked the higher court to hold it up while they asked for a review of the contempt findings.

But the Supreme Court justices said long standing policy prevented their acting on the request until the other party had been notified. The other party is the state of Alabama, represented by Atty. Gen. John Patterson, who on June 1 obtained from Jones an injunction against NAACP activities in Alabama.

The records were asked by Patterson in an effort to sustain his reasons for the injunction.

Chief Justice J. Ed Livingston set a Supreme Court hearing for 10 a.m. Tuesday on the stay request.

Routine Check Nets Escapee, Stolen Auto

A California penal camp escapee in a stolen car was apprehended at Salem Monday by a state policeman who became suspicious after stopping the youth for a routine check.

On questioning, the youth readily admitted to Patrolman Walter Karau that the license plates were switched, then that the car was stolen, and finally that he had escaped from Pine Grove Camp near Tracy, Calif., where he had been sentenced for a previous car theft.

The 1956 model car was stolen from a new car dealer's lot in Sacramento, Calif., shortly after his escape Friday, and driven through Nevada and Idaho before entering Oregon, police said.

The plates on the car at the time of his arrest were stolen Sunday in Burns, they said.

Luster was taken to Marion County jail to be held for California authorities or the Federal Bureau of Investigation, which entered the case because the stolen car was taken across a state line.

Oregon Demo Chief Denies Nixing Morse

PORTLAND (U)—Mrs. Virginia Grant, Democratic national committee woman-elect for Oregon, Monday called "completely untrue" a statement in a national weekly magazine that she is "no Morse supporter."

The statement appears in a picture caption in an article entitled "Grudge Fight in Oregon" in this week's Saturday Evening Post, appearing on newstands Tuesday.

"I have admired Wayne Morse for many years and have no idea why the Saturday Evening Post claims otherwise," Mrs. Grant said in a statement issued from her headquarters here.

Meanwhile, Sen. Morse was making plans for re-election campaigning next month in Douglas County. He is scheduled to speak at a Democratic picnic in Roseburg Aug. 1 and return there Aug. 8 for other engagements.

Personality of Seeing-Eye Dog, Blind Master Part of Matching Task at School

Seeing Eye dogs are paired with their masters with the same care that should be used in selecting a marriage partner. George Wernitz, executive director of the organization, said Monday on his first visit to Salem.

The husky former educator attended a dinner Monday evening at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Carl Greider, 645 S. Church St. Greider has the only Seeing Eye dog in Salem. The faithful German Shepherd, Jerry, is one of 25 dogs which have been placed in Oregon by the organization.

Also attending the dinner were Mr. and Mrs. Everett Wilcox and Mr. and Mrs. Walter Dry. Wilcox is superintendent of Oregon State School for the Blind and Dry is former superintendent.

Compliment Each Other
The dog must be suitable to the person he is to guide in temperament as well as size and build. Wernitz said. That does not mean they have to be of the same temperament, but they must complement each other.

"For instance, a man a little on the Mr. Milquetoast side needs a dog with a little more 'oomph,'" Wernitz illustrated.

Wernitz considers Seeing Eye, incorporated in the U.S. in 1929, a rehabilitation program rather than a dog school.

"One of the greatest losses when a person loses his sight is his inability to get around," he said.

Few Use Guides
Only about five per cent of the blind want and can use a guide dog. Wernitz says. The others are too old to learn, too young or immature for a solid relationship with the dog, have partial sight and therefore cannot learn to "rely entirely on the dog," or have physical handicaps. "You have to walk along at a pretty good clip, you know," Wernitz said.

"Dogs are for people who want to be totally independent, who want to go places and do things."

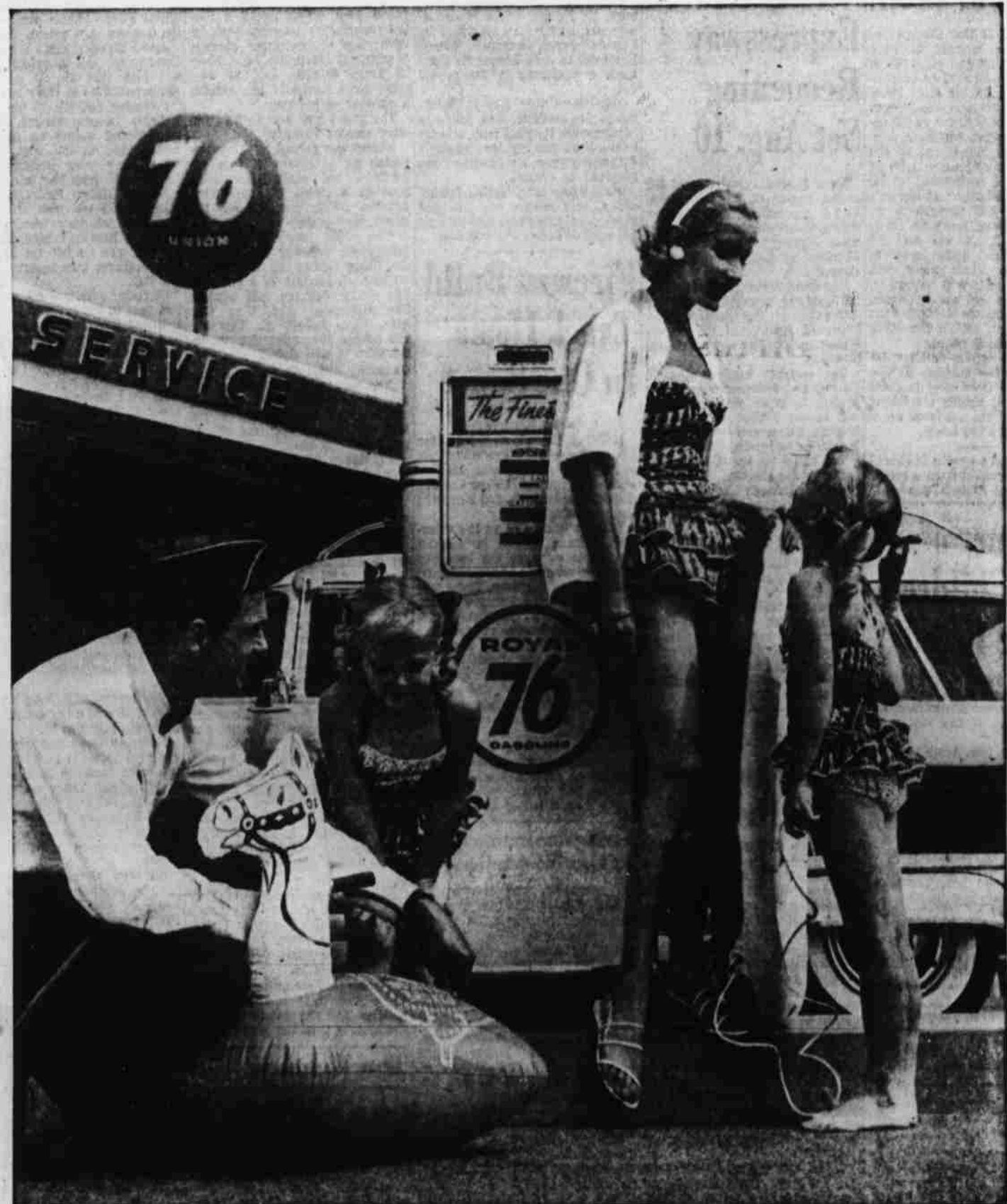
BEE GUARD WHISKY
