

Hodge Sent to Prison

Illinois Auditor Gets 10 Years In Fraud Count

CHICAGO (AP)—Orville E. Hodge, the popular, fun-loving Illinois state auditor who took home a sizable chunk of the state's treasury, was sentenced Wednesday to 10 years in prison.

But the 10 years is only part of the price he must pay for tapping the till for almost a million dollars by cashing bogus state checks. The punishment decided upon was a federal indictment to which he pleaded guilty. He still awaits sentencing on state charges.

The federal indictment originally contained 14 counts alleging Hodge misappropriated \$975,000 in federal bank funds. For technical reasons prosecutors weeded out three counts which brought the figure down to \$610,427.

Hodge has pleaded guilty in the Sangamon County Circuit Court in Springfield to the indictment alleging he took \$637,000 in state funds.

Sharp Contrast

The Hodge who appeared before Judge John P. Barnes in U. S. District Court was a sharp contrast to the hail-fellow-sell-me-Republican state officer who a few weeks ago was buzzing around in a private airplane and maintaining luxurious quarters in Springfield, Chicago and Florida.

He mopped his brow and flicked tears from his eyes as his lawyer, Arthur Fitzgerald, entered a plea of guilty.

The government had expected the defense to plan for a delay in sentencing but Fitzgerald said Hodge "wants to get it over with."

Whereupon Judge Barnes sorted the 14 counts into four groups which for all practical purposes amounted to a sentence of 10 years in prison. The judge's action also made provision for a program of restitution which Hodge has instituted.

Hodge, 51, was taken in a wheelchair from St. John's Hospital in Springfield before dawn for a trip in a squad car to Chicago for his court appearance. He had been hospitalized since spending a few hours in the Sangamon County Jail Monday after pleading to the state charges.

Hodge has been weakened by the physical strain and depression that overwhelmed him since the fast developing scandal knocked him out of the Republican state administration and the path to possible governorship slightly more than a month ago.

Whether Hodge will celebrate his next few birthdays in a United States or an Illinois penitentiary depends upon which his defense attorneys choose.

Judge Barnes made no choice but expressed a desire that "the sentence imposed here be served concurrently with any sentence imposed by the state."

Final Link in Natural Gas Pipeline Due

PORTLAND (AP)—Gas company officials Thursday will bolt into place the final link in a 1,346-mile pipeline connecting the Portland-Vancouver area with natural gas fields in northern New Mexico.

The ceremony will be on Sauvie Island, in the Columbia River near here, with officials of the Pacific Northwest Pipeline Corp. and Portland Gas & Coke Co., handling the wrenches.

Within the next two weeks natural gas from the Southwest will flow through the new pipeline for customers in the Pacific Northwest.

Speakers at Thursday's program include Jerome K. Kuykendall, chairman of the Federal Power Commission, and Howard Pyle, former Arizona governor, who now is deputy assistant to the President.

Funeral for Baby Friday

Funeral services for Allan Scott Page, two-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Malcolm Page, 375 Waldo St., will be held at 1:30 p.m. Friday in the chapel of the W. T. Riden funeral home, the Rev. Wayne Greene officiating.

Allan died Tuesday at a Portland hospital following an extended illness. The death was attributed to cancer. He was born in Salem, July 17, 1948.

Survivors include, in addition to his parents, a brother, Roger, 10; grandmothers, Mr. and Mrs. Leo Page, Salem, and Mr. and Mrs. H. W. Campbell, Sacramento, Calif.; and Mrs. W. S. Riden, Santa Ana, Calif.

Interment will be at Belcrest Memorial Park.

Tabulation Indicates Adlai Near First-Ballot Victory

CHICAGO (AP)—Adlai Stevenson edged up on a first ballot Democratic nomination for president Wednesday night, carried by a bandwagon movement among big delegations and a scattering of minor shifts elsewhere.

At 8:15 p.m. EST the Associated Press tabulation of delegates, based on commitments through caucuses and otherwise, and the expressed preferences of delegates not yet tied down, showed him only 17½ votes shy of the 58½ required for a quick decision when the balloting starts Thursday night. Other shifts were in the making.

The count:

Stevenson 609, Averell Harriman 239, others 257, uncommitted or unreachable 207.

Michigan started its shift shortly after midnight Wednesday night by moving most of its votes, previously committed to Gov. G. Mennen Williams, into the Stevenson column. Technically the ballots were still tied to Williams but the governor himself was urging a first ballot shift.

Then Wednesday morning New Jersey swung its whole 36 votes to Stevenson and Arkansas followed with 26, with the proviso that a satisfactory platform would be required to make the shift effective.

A third youth has been implicated in one of a string of recent Marion County burglaries. It was reported Wednesday by the Marion County sheriff's office. Two other youths previously had been charged with six burglaries.

The third youth booked, said Sheriff Denver Young, was Emory Dwight Leighty, 17, Silverton. His arrest followed questioning about a break-in at the East Side Market at Silverton and Lancaster roads. Also charged with burglary of the market is Ronald Eugene Huffman, 16.

Huffman and Raymond Sander Ainge of MacLaren School for Boys previously had been charged with six burglaries last Friday in the Woodburn and Gervais areas.

A quantity of beer and cigarettes was taken from East Side Market, Young said.

Leighty and Huffman are in Marion County juvenile hall ward awaiting further action on their cases. Ainge was returned to MacLaren School pending a hearing.

Ex-VO History Department Leader Dies

EUGENE (AP)—Dan E. Clark, 72, head of the University of Oregon history department from 1940 until his retirement in 1961, died here Tuesday night after a long illness.

A noted historian, Clark's best known work was "The West in American History."

He was a member of the American Historical Society and served as president of the Pacific Coast branch in 1961. At the time of his death, he was a director of the Oregon Historical Society.

State to Scan Outside Office Space Needs

A survey of all state-owned and state-occupied properties will be conducted soon by the governor's Capitol Area Office Space Committee.

The survey is to determine whether additional space is required to house state activities. The state finance department already has under consideration plans to lease 14,000 square feet of space in downtown Salem to house crowded departments.

The space committee met for the first time in Salem Wednesday and elected State Sen. John Merrifield, Portland, chairman. State Rep. George Annala, Hood River, was named secretary.

A report from the committee will go to the 1957 Legislature. It has been suggested that a new building be erected to house the new state Motor Vehicle Department which currently is scattered among several buildings in the Capitol area.

Portland Man Dismissed in Robbery Count

A charge of robbery not armed with a dangerous weapon against Wack Taylor, Portland, was dismissed Wednesday in Marion County District Court. Taylor currently is serving a year's sentence in Multnomah County on a petty larceny charge.

Taylor was charged with being one of three men who last December robbed Mrs. Mary Nixon, 415 Division St. Mrs. Nixon's purse reportedly was snatched after she was knocked down by a man, who then sped away in a waiting car.

One reason for the dismissal was the Nixon robbery was reported for Washington authorities, who want to revoke Taylor's parole on a 15-year sentence for grand larceny.

Two other men charged with the Nixon robbery, Willie Junior Coleman and Leonard Daniel Clark, currently are serving 10 years and six years respectively in the Oregon State Penitentiary on charges of assault and robbery.

Accident Victim Said Improving

James Perry Wells, 22, Gervais, injured in an auto accident Sunday near Hopewell, was reported Wednesday to be improving at Salem Memorial Hospital. Hospital attendants said Wells was semi-conscious Wednesday. He received head injuries in the weekend accident.

Oregon Demos Reject HST, Root for Adlai

CHICAGO (AP)—The Oregon delegation to the Democratic National Convention Wednesday took issue with former President Truman, who said Adlai Stevenson could not win the presidency in November.

Delegates approved a statement prepared by Sen. Richard Neuberger which said:

"We in Oregon, who have seen Adlai Stevenson win a tense primary election over an outstanding opponent, do not agree with Harry Truman's claim that Mr. Stevenson cannot win in the fall. Nor, despite our personal affection for Mr. Truman, do we regard Mr. Truman as an authority in this respect."

"Mr. Truman was the man who said that Tom Hennings and Stuart Symington were not winning candidates for the Democratic Party in Missouri. Yet, Democratic voters in Mr. Truman's home state disregarded Mr. Truman's advice, and both Symington and Hennings went on triumphantly to the United States Senate."

"In our opinion, Adlai Stevenson is by far the strongest possible nominee our party could place before the country. We also consider Sen. Estes Kefauver his logical running mate."

The Oregon delegation is pledged to support Stevenson for the presidency and Kefauver for the vice presidency. They were the winning candidates in the Oregon primary election last May.

Kerr Claims GOP Rules 'By Deception'

CONVENTION HALL, Chicago (AP)—Sen. Robert S. Kerr of Oklahoma accused the Eisenhower administration Wednesday night of a "policy of government by deception."

Kerr, a contender for the presidency himself in 1952, received the most colorful demonstration of any 1956 national convention speaker to date. Fellow Oklahomans in Indian headresses stomped around in front of the lectern and waved their signs for the senator.

The multimillionaire Kerr, one of the nation's wealthiest oil men, said the Republicans have led farmers and workers to "a resedevous with deception."

Harks to Slogans

He harked back to the 1952 GOP campaign slogan of "prosperity is just around the corner" and "two chickens in every pot." Kerr got a laugh when he said:

"I lived through the four years under (Herbert) Hoover. I was as well off but... I didn't have two cars... I didn't have two chickens. In fact, I didn't have one chicken — and not even a pot to cook it in!"

1,000-Acre Washington Blaze Rages

COLVILLE, Wash. (AP)—More than 100 men are battling a 1,000-acre forest fire which raged out of control about 20 miles northwest of here Wednesday night.

A rainstorm Wednesday afternoon appears to have slowed somewhat the advance of the blaze which broke out Tuesday in a logging site and spread rapidly.

John Linke, district site forester at Colville, said five logging companies have sent crews into the area. Four bulldozers were being used in the area. Crews were reported to be having trouble with new spot fires breaking out behind them.

State Forester L. M. Webster said at Olympia that the fire was the largest ever reported on state-owned land. The fire has spread into large stands of fir, pine and larch.

Court Dismisses Charge Against Judge Seabold

HILLSBORO (AP)—Washington County Judge Harry M. Seabold Wednesday was freed on a charge of illegally accepting a real estate commission.

Circuit Judge Ralph Holman, ruling there was insufficient evidence to send the case to the jury, ordered the charge against Seabold dismissed.

Seabold, testifying in his own defense at Wednesday's session, denied any wrongdoing.

Dist. Atty. James K. Gardner had contended Judge Seabold maintained an interest in a real estate firm managed by his son, and that Seabold accepted illegally a \$925 commission from a county property transaction handled by the company.

Fire in Ship Under Control

ASTORIA (AP)—A smoldering coal fire in the No. 2 hold of the freighter Orizaba was under control Wednesday night but the cargo ship was heading back for the Columbia River, the Coast Guard reported.

The Orizaba radioed word of the fire late Wednesday from a position 400 miles west of the Columbia River. The vessel had sailed from Portland Monday with 8,500 tons of coal for Korea. The Coast Guard dispatched the cutter Yeocoma to meet the Orizaba and accompany it to port.

It is due here Friday morning and probably will go upriver to Portland.

The Orizaba, owned by Bulk Carriers, Inc., New York, is operated by the General Steamship Corp.
