

Keynoter Langlie Calls for 4 More Years of GOP Crusade

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Gov. Arthur E. Langlie of Washington, the 40th convention keynoter, rallied his fellow Republicans Monday night to "four more years of our crusade for a finer America."

The formal address that traditionally re-stokes the fires of party enthusiasm. He hotly blasted the Democrats as corrupt and divided; he warmly praised the Republicans as bringers of peace, prosperity and progress.

"We are here," he told the delegates in his speech, "to pledge to the American people four more years of honest, efficient administration for our government by the fine men and women who have been called to serve them at Washington."

Ike Upholds Ban on U.S. Newsmen Travel to China

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower Monday firmly backed a State Department ban on travel to Red China by American newsmen.

The State Department announced on Aug. 7 it would refuse to grant valid passports to more than a dozen American newsmen who had been invited by the Chinese Communist government to visit the Red mainland.

Ike V.P. Plans Not Known By Hagerty

WASHINGTON (AP) — James C. Hagerty, White House press secretary, told newsmen Monday he has been "stalling" and frankly doesn't know what course President Eisenhower might take in the selection of his Vice Presidential running mate.
