

Junior High School Water Supply Aired

The Salem School Board again met Thursday night with the problem of water for the new Junior High School south of Salem on Jones Road. No decision was reached.

Board members, who met earlier in the summer with the Salem Heights Water Board over the matter, favor a well located in South Salem Chamber of Commerce Park. The water board has offered this well for school needs as well as one currently being drilled on Hubbard Road.

In previous discussions, it was proposed that the water board pay for laying of lines from the park well to edge of school property, with the school district to foot cost of lines on its property.

GOP Denies Young Liberals Desert McKay's Campaign

PORTLAND (AP)—Republicans denied Thursday a charge by a Democratic Party official that the "liberal wing" of the Republican Party has defected from Douglas McKay's campaign for Oregon senator.

Mike Katz, president of the Young Democratic Club of Greater Portland, said that within the past month "there has been a wholesale departure of young liberal Republicans from the McKay campaign because of dissatisfaction with McKay's tactics."

Paul Hebb and Nathan Heath, who headed the campaign of Phil Hitchcock, leader of McKay in the Republican primary, recently resigned top campaign posts with the McKay organization.

Katz said he was "reliably informed" Hebb and Heath resigned "because McKay failed to live up to an agreement with them that they would have complete control over the campaign and that McKay would not permit his campaign to be run by the GOP old guard."

Hebb termed this "absolutely untrue." He said he had no disagreement with McKay but resigned to take the post of campaign coordinator for all statewide

In accordance with the plans, specifications, and estimates for such sewer which were adopted by the Common Council August 13, 1956, which are now on file in the office of the city recorder and which by this reference thereto are made a part of this notice.

The Common Council declares its purpose and intention to make such sewer improvement at the expense and cost of the property the Common Council deems benefited by the construction of such sewer, to-wit: property in the following described district:

Lots 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11, Crestview Addition, City of Salem, Marion County, Oregon, also the southerly 194 feet of Lot 25, Riverside Acres, City of Salem, Marion County, Oregon.

The Common Council will, at 7:30 o'clock p.m., September 12, 1956, in the council chambers of the city hall, hear and consider objections, if any there be, to the proposed sewer improvement, or the assessment of the total cost or any part of the cost thereof against said district or any particular property therein.

The plans and specifications above referred to may be examined at the office of the city recorder, and any interested property owner may ascertain his approximate share of the cost of making the improvement at the office of the city engineer.

Short Power Supply Seen

PORTLAND (AP)—Interruptible power supplies to Pacific Northwest electro-process plants may have to be curtailed by the end of September unless there is early, heavy rainfall.

Representatives of 18 such plants in Oregon and Washington which use interruptible power received this report here Thursday from Bonneville Administrator William A. Pearl.

The stream flow of the Columbia River, which is increased by fall and winter rains, determines whether interruptible, or surplus, power deliveries must be curtailed.

Pearl said this power may be available to all or most users if rainfall is heavy, but it could be eliminated entirely if weather is unfavorable to hydro-power generation.

Most of the plants produce aluminum or other metals.

Campaign Chest of \$20,000 Offered Mythical Joe Smith

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—"Joe Smith" vanished Thursday like the fog on a sunny San Francisco morning but he must have had a lot of friends around the country. He even acquired a financial backer—the bankroll is \$20,000 if necessary, a press agent said—and staged a political comeback of sorts on possibly the smallest boom in political history.

Terry Carpenter, creator of the imaginary "Joe," reported he received about 200 telegrams, and many phone calls after he convulsed the Republican national convention Wednesday night by trying to nominate his fanciful creature for Vice President.

Carpenter said his home and office phones were swamped with calls at Terrytown, Neb., his town on the edge of Scotts Bluff.

Obviously enjoying it all, Carpenter said most of the telegrams raised his attempt to keep the convention "open" by putting up someone to run against Vice President Richard Nixon.

Many Messages

The folks back home responded with such messages to delegates as these:

"I'll accept the nomination. Joe Smith."

"I'll be available as soon as I can get a baby sitter. Mrs. Joe Smith."

In New York "Joe" went on to bigger and better things with his adoption by restaurateur Col. Charles Cobb.

Through the press agent, Cobb announced from his penthouse office that he will conduct a nationwide write-in campaign—pretty girls buttonholing voters, campaign buttons, demands for free radio-TV time; in short, the works.

Cobb, 46, and a colonel of the Kentucky sort, is a Republican who admired—without doing anything about it—the campaign of
