Adlai Rebukes Ike Version of GOP Record

LIBERTYVILLE, Ill. (AP) — Adlai Stevenson perfected his campaign organization Friday even as he denounced President Eisenhower for a "Republican record" which Stevenson said bears little resemblance to the President's description of it.

He announced appointment of Clayton Fritchey, deputy Democratic national chairman, as his press secretary, and formalized the appointments of others who will assist him in planning strategy for daylight-to-dawn stumpings in his Presidential campaign.

A formal announcement said the entire campaign will be run from Washington.

Fritchey was given top authority for all dealings with newspaper, TV, radio and other news outlets to match his position with that of James C. Hagerty, President Eisenhower's news secretary.

"Three Sing," final summer production of the Pentacle Players. The musical comedy, the most pretentious the players have yet attempted, was one of the best, if audience acclaim is a good indication.

With a plot centered around the campaign and election of John P. Wintergreen for president on a platform of Love, and with many songs that have endured since its premiere in 1931, the selection of this as the final play of the season was a happy one.

Large Cast
The cast is large, about 30, the choruses made up of youngsters many of whom have worked backstage with the Players for several years, but have not before appeared on the stage. Costumes are colorful (most of them designed and made for the occasion), the choruses well drilled and the dance routines, though limited for lack of space, are adequate. The leads were chosen from the more experienced members of the company.

Excitement begins with the opening chorus, when singers are showered with confetti distributed to the audience in exchange for tickets. Action is fast moving until the finale, when Mrs. Wintergreen presents the USA with twins.

During intermission, especially filmed election returns are shown on the screen outside as part of the action of the play.

Lively Candidate
Mac Baker is a lively Wintergreen, his second important part with the Pentacle Players this season. Jan Thompson, new to the group is a lovable Mary Turner (Mrs. Wintergreen). Mac Brand, Dick Smith and G. Elmer Spencer, Dick Schmidt and Paul D. Baker are the five politicians who make the president. Dick Geer comes through as usual, with an excellent performance as the unknown vice-president. Throtheadbottom, Barbara Rhule is Dianna Devereaux, winner in the beauty contest but loser in love. Althea Ferris, a reliable comedienne, is the blonde Benson. Jim Chittick makes a fine French Ambassador.

\$375 Per Ton Paid for Tuna At Astoria

ASTORIA, Ore. (AP) — A fisherman reported Friday he received \$375 a ton for three tons of albacore tuna delivered to a cannery here.

Art Anderson, skipper of the fishing boat Betty, said about 150 boats from Oregon, Washington and California were fishing along the Northwest coast for the first major run of tuna in this area since 1945.

The run, divided into three groups, is heading northward, he said, and is now nearing Astoria. California boats are following the run up the coast, Anderson reported.

Two of the tuna groups are being fished. Anderson said the third is about 60 feet deep and is 100 miles off the Oregon coast.

Man Charged in Attack on Child

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Phone Union, Firm Renew Contract Talk

NEW YORK (AP) — The Western Electric Co., and the Communications Workers of America resumed talks in an effort to hammer out a new pact for some 18,000 telephone installers.

It could not be learned whether or not progress was made. The negotiations stalled on Monday. The last contract expired Saturday midnight and there has been talk of a walkout.

Union President Joseph A. Beirne said a strike could occur "in the very near future" unless a satisfactory agreement is worked out.

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Russia Warns Allies Against Seizing Suez

LONDON (AP) — Soviet Foreign Minister Dmitri Shepilov warned Friday night that serious consequences may result in the Middle East if the West tries to break Egypt's grip on the Suez Canal.

The 22-nation London conference is sending a five-nation committee to propose international control of the Canal to Egypt's President Gamal Abdel Nasser.

Addressing a news conference at the Soviet Embassy, Shepilov said: "It would be wrong to underestimate the gravity of the situation that might arise as a result of the activity of quarters in the United States, Britain or France to seek to have the problem settled from positions of strength."

He charged that military preparations during the Suez crisis were "flagrant violation of the United Nations charter."

"The Soviet Union considers it necessary to voice a warning regarding the serious consequences in the Middle East that might be brought about if the position in the Suez Canal were to be changed."

Another warning came from British Foreign Minister Selwyn Lloyd—this one to Egypt. Lloyd was asked on a TV show what would happen if Nasser says no to the committee in its majority decision from the 22-nation Suez Canal conference calling for an international operating authority.

"I hope that that is precisely the question he is asking himself," the foreign minister replied.

MOSCOW (AP) — Nikita S. Khrushchev says "the Arabs will not stand alone" if the Suez crisis starts a war.

"It will be a just war and there will be volunteers," Khrushchev said.

He was taken to the station where officers attempted to learn his name while the youngster gave the office the once-over. The lad finally recalled his last name and police tracked down his parents through the directory.

TOKYO (AP) — Asahi, a big Japanese newspaper, says Japan's ministry of transportation is planning by 1960 to have in operation two 22,000-ton luxury ships capable of carrying 700 passengers each, for tourist trade between Japan and the U.S. West Coast.

Cost of each ship was estimated at \$20,833,333.
